In the name of God Amen. I James Lane of the County of Wilt
and State of Tennessee being in health of body and of sound and disposing
mind and memory (thanks be to God for the same) coming to mind the mortality
of my body and knowing that it is appointed unto all men here to die
do hereby declare, constitute and appoint, this my last will and
testament, that in the only principle, and fear of God, I give and bequeath
into the hands of Almighty God who gave it, and my body to
be buried in decent Christian burial, thus to rest under the
protection of the almighty arm of all the dead. And as touching
those worldly estate and goods which I have given to my wife, I give,
bequeath, devise and dispose of the same in form and manner following
to wit. First. I devise that all my just and lawful debts including
any funeral expences, and all my unpaid taxes and paid out of my personal

estate. I give and bequeath to my son James Lane for and on
behalf of the same, and all his heirs and assigns, which I give and bequeath
and I give and bequeath to him and his heirs and assigns for ever, the same being clear
of all encumbrances of any kind whatsoever, by him to be possessed and enjoyed
in fee at my death. I have given in part and sold in part to him all and
singular my stock of horses, cattle &c. and all my working tools and farming
implements, except one gray horse and two cows, this I have reserved for my
own use, and I have no positive injunction to lay him as an heir, I express a
hope, that after my death he will protect his two unmarried sisters who will
then be destitute of a home and unprotected.

Item 3rd. I have given and bequeathed to my daughter Martha fifty
dollars in a note on my son James Lane for to be paid in store goods at
different installments, which note he has discharged and a fifth, and I further
give and bequeath to her one share of the Coffin put now in my possession.

Item 4th. I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary a share of one hundred
dollars in a note on James Lane for for that amount to be paid in store
goods at the annual installments, which note is now nearly discharged.

Item 5th. I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary, one hundred
dollars in two notes, one on William Wilson for sixty dollars and one on
James Lane for forty dollars both to be paid in store goods by install-
ments of ten dollars each annually.

Item 6th. I give and bequeath to my two daughters Mary and
Mary and to my wife George and Nancy Adams all and singular
the residue of my personal estate, including my riding horse (if any
I have) my two cows, my house hold furniture of every kind and all
descriptions whatever, consisting of Beds, bed covers and furniture, Basons
clocks, cupboards and a furniture, to be equally divided among them with
the particular attention, that the Beds, be a second and furniture on which
I live is to be allotted to Nancy Adams in part of her share, and the
one third or allotted to him shall go up in the payment of his share
and a quarter to the balance which I have on him.

Item 7th. My wife Mary I give to all my married sons and daughters
who have left and for all apartments at the time of their marriage
as my husband and wife would do, if they were not for a my self able to
do any thing more for them; save only, that I give to my son Jacob A.
Lane my working stuff.

Item 8th. It is my will and a desire that all my personal estate
be sold except such beds, bedding, stocks &c. as my daughters may
choose to keep for their own use and that the proceeds of the sale
be appraised out a quality to the P. Fund, so that finally the
same may be equal. And I do hereby appoint my two sons
Jacob A. Lane and James Lane my executors of this my last
will and testament hoping they will take the charge upon them
and that they will see that this my last will is carried into
