It is my will that after the death of my beloved wife Nancy that the above property shall be equally divided among my natural heirs to wit William H. Wilson, Daniel Wilson, James B. Wilson, Sarah D. Wilson, David G. Wilson, Susannah Wilson, Nancy Wilson, Hartwell G. Wilson, share and share alike without any exceptions whatever.

5th and Lastly, I do hereby appoint my son David G. Wilson to be my executor to carry this my last will and testament into full and legal effect this nineteenth day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty.

I find in the hands of the administrator the sum of One thousand, One hundred and twenty one Dollars, twenty nine Cents of available means in money and good debts. I would however remark, that I have charged the administrator not only with all the sale money and interest, collected, but also with all good debts or have and such of them as are in progress of collection, which considerably swells the amount of available means in the hands of the administrator which owing to the slow progress of the same, together with the hard work of the times he has been unable to commensurate. The administrator is also charged with all the doubtful and bad debts for which, such credits are given, as the administrator is justly entitled to. All debts uncollected are brought into this settlement and charged on the estate, without interest, as the same may be without interest, except in a few cases, whether good, doubtful or bad. The administrator was under the necessity of having to receive some Mississippi money which was collected by agency agreeable to the instruction of the Decree, which money is of that description, that render it unavailable, which is now on hand.

I would further remark that owing to the multiplicity of business, the large amount of property and goods to sell by auction, and debts necessarily to a large amount to make therefor, it was almost impossible in the nature of things not to make some bad debts of this kind of bad debts the administrator has contracted between 150 and 170 dollars, which I believe it my duty now to allow the administrator, as part therefor, but owing to the peculiar circumstances of the case, I suggest to the worshipful Court if it would not be right and proper to make him allowed therefor, so that if a loss should be eventually sustained, that it may be borne equally by all the legatees.

The administrator charges for his services in closing the business of the late firm of White & Young the sum of One hundred Dollars of 100, and for the settling the estate of the Decree the sum of Two hundred Dollars, which I think is reasonable. I would further suggest to the worshipful Court that the act of appointing the clerk for making settlements and receiving the same, the sum of Two dollars and fifty Cents and such additional allowance as the Court in their wisdom shall direct and that Justice might require. I therefore submit this settlement and the receiving of the same to the worshipful Court for an additional allowance. The Court will see from an inspection of this report and settlement, that is very voluminous, a very large estate, and has required a great deal of time and careful examination and calculations to make it. The Court will also see that it is made in a plain, simple manner and easy to be understood.
