Item 1st I give and bequeath to my well beloved Wife Nancy Earles three Tract of land wherein I now live containing two hundred and together with all the buildings improvements and appurtenances of what kind soever to be by her free use occupied and enjoyed with all and singular the income and profits thereof for and during the Term of fourteen years from this day also all the household and Kitchen furniture and all my stock of horses cattle hogs and sheep and all my grain of every description for the special use and benefit of my Wife Nancy Earles and her five children also my Will is that my Negro man slave named Moses aged about forty years is to be and remain the property of my well beloved wife Nancy Earles during the Term of fourteen years next from this day and he is to have full power to hire said slave Moses to whom he please or to keep him at home on the farm as she may think proper Item 2nd I give and bequeath unto my eldest son Martin Earles the sum of three hundred dollars to be paid out of the Money arising from the sales of the lands and personal property which is to be sold at the expiration of fourteen years from this day Item 3rd My Will is that all my debts is to be collected and applied to the sole and proper use of my well beloved Wife Nancy Earles and her five children Item 4th My Will is that all my lands and personal property which may remain not disposed of otherwise
