I James Officer of the County of Albion and State of Tennessee Considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of sound mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and Testament according and making void all other wills by me at any time heretofore made, to take effect at and to the place and to the end hereinafter expressed, I dispose of the same as follows, Which I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Anne Officer all my real and personal estate, which consists of the real estate containing of three hundred and forty acres, of lands, and my personal estate consisting of two negroes, horses, cattle, sheep, all the household and kitchen furniture, and all my money or lands or any that may be attached to the estate, My daughter Elizabeth Johnson has received Three hundred and thirty dollars, My son James Officer has received Three hundred and thirty four dollars, My daughter Susan Johnson has received Three hundred and thirty four dollars, My daughter Margaret Officer has received Three hundred and thirty dollars, My daughter Sarah Johnson has received Three hundred and thirty dollars, My daughter Amanda Officer, Betsey Officer and William Officer each Three hundred and thirty dollars and each of the above named children, Elizabeth Johnson, Alexander Officer, Samuel Johnson, Margaret Officer & Sarah Johnson, to be paid by the Executors each to them to make up Three hundred and thirty dollars and thirty cents including what they have received.

My dear daughter Elizabeth Johnson I give and bequeath unto her, her life time thirty five dollars and thirty cents, which make her Three hundred and thirty dollars and thirty cents and what James Officer has received, and after her death to the body of her heirs which is to be paid at the discretion of the Executors to each of the above named heirs. I give and bequeath to my two sons Betsey Officer and William Officer all my lands which contains Three hundred and forty acres to be equally divided between them, after the death of my beloved wife Anne Officer. And then pay the other heirs their equal parts to the two daughters, and I further give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Johnson all her part in Real and the personal of my estate coming to her, her lifetime, and then to go to the body of her heirs at her death. John Henry Litter as on the 8th day of January A.D. 1849 the Administrators of Joseph Litter deceased appeared in open Court before said Judge and said Judge ordered the said Administrators to enter into and upon all and singular things and chattels rights and debts of the said deceased and then into his possession take inventory the same may be found in this State and an inventory to return into this Court within the time limited by Law. And he paid debts of the said deceased to pay it from the said estate and which is annexed to this Court Clerk of our said Court at Office the first Monday in January A.D. 1849 and in the twenty third year of American Independence

First - I declare that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible. Second - I give and bequeath to my beloved children John Litter, William Litter and Mary Elizabeth Litter as the three following named slaves - Martha and her boy Dick also Martha another woman aged about thirty years. (Third) I give and bequeath unto my dear wife Maryann Litter the following described tract of land in the County of Travis & State of Texas. Beginning on the south bank of Onion Creek and being a part and parcel of the tract I own aside upon - and bounded as follows - Beginning on the bank of said creek one hundred yds below where my new dwelling house now stands - Thence in a straight line S. E. direction to a the foot of a high Prairie ridge about a half mile distant from said bank - Crossing over a stake at the point - where said Ridge turns its course from a N. W. to a S. W. course nearly at right angles as said same fully appear by reference to the plat annexed. Thence continuing a part and parcel of this instrument, Thence running at the end of said stake while it intersects the upper boundary line of my land - Thence S. 60. E. with the said upper boundary line to the N. W. corner of my tract of land - Thence S. 30. E. and across the creek to the place of beginning containing about two hundred acres more or less. This bequest is made upon the following conditions, to be the property of my wife during her life - and if she should marry - in that event - said land and property to go to my children. (Fourth) I give and bequeath and give to my dear wife two hundred and fifty acres of land lying above & adjoining with the last mentioned two hundred acres tract fronting the creek for over a complete description reference is given to the annexed plat in this instrument, I give this last mentioned tract upon the same conditions as the first. (Fifth) I bequeath unto my children when named are hereafter mentioned in this instrument the residue of my tract of land which I reside upon - including my farm - and containing about seventeen hundred acres of land fronting the south bank of Onion Creek for further description see the annexed plat in this instrument. (Sixth) I bequeath unto my dear daughter Elizabeth Litter one hundred dollars to be paid to her or her heirs as follows - By the hundred dollars in annual payments until the whole be paid the first payment to be made the first day of November Eighteen hundred and forty nine. I hereby direct my Executors to raise said money as follows - out of debts due my estate the hundred fifty dollars - Out of lands not already appropriated in this Will belonging to my estate in Texas the hundred fifty dollars. (Seventh) I bequeath unto my dear children when named have been before mentioned all of my landed estate in Texas including all land claims of every description whatever which I own and possess and have claims to as a part thereof already appropriated in this instrument. (Eighth) I bequeath and give to my dear wife my personal property - all claims due me for money & my stock of Horses - Mules - Cattle - Dogs - Haggons - Silver hold and kitchen furniture & of all my description of personal property whatever
