I am Sir I give and agree to my daughter Fanny that the sum of six hundred dollars to be paid out by my Executor for a negro Girl slave, which negro girl she is to purchase shall be gifted and freely enjoyed by my said daughter and Fanny together with her income during her natural life. If she should marry and have heirs of her body then at her death the said negro girl heron bought and her income shall immediately descend to the heirs of her body but should she die without heirs of her body then said negro girl with her income shall revert to my estate and shall then be equally divided between all my children or their legal representatives &c

Last Will and Testament of William Erwin Decd.

In the name of God Amen. I William Erwin being of sound and perfect mind and memory and considering the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following: First, I commit my body to the dust as it was, and my soul to God who gave it, leaving my kind, discretionary with my executor.

Secondly, I give and bequeath to my eldest son John W. Erwin an hundred and twenty five acres of my land beginning on the east boundary line of a One hundred acre survey, known my residence and Court. Barker, running in a Westward direction so as to include all of the said John W. Erwin in premises to have and to hold to him the said John W. Erwin he here and assigns forever also I give and bequeath to him one feather bed and bolster, also I give and bequeath to him One Rifle Gun and a larder of provisions.

Thirdly, I give and bequeath unto my son Isaac Newton Erwin his here and assigns all the balance of my land including the place where I now live to have and to hold to him the said Isaac Newton his here and assigns forever. I also give and bequeath to him all my live stock including horses, cattle, hogs and sheep, also one feather bed and bolster. Also I give and bequeath unto him the live and furniture which I have now in my house also the balance of my household furniture viz Cupboards, Sath, Chairs &c I also give and bequeath unto him my Cutting Knife and Steel also my Kitchen furniture. I also will that my Carpenter's Tools including a Cross cut Saw Broad Axe &c be divided equally between my two sons John W. Erwin and Isaac N. Erwin. I also give and bequeath my Grandson William Erwin my Pocket book and Shaving Kit. And lastly I will that the Bequest which I have made against William Barker if it can be collected to be divided equally between my two daughters, viz Lucinda Barker and Minerva Wright. And I hereby appoint my two sons John W. Erwin and Isaac N. Erwin my sole executors of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former Wills by me made.
