In the name of God Amen I Mary Margaret of the County of White in the State of Tennessee being in good health and of sound and disposing mind and memory, thanketh to God for the same And owing to wond the Mortality of the Body and knowing that it is appointed unto all men once to die, And being desirous to make disposition of what worldly estate with orbis I am blessed to my satisfaction to make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner following etc. In the first place I direct all my just debts and burial expenses to be paid out of my estate.

I bind 2nd I give and bequeath to my daughter Anna the sum of one hundred dollars to be laid out by my Executor for a negro girl slave, which negro girl is to be purchased and freely enjoyed by my said daughter Anna together with her increase during her natural life. If she should have more than one girl and their future increase shall revert back to my estate and shall then be equally divided between all my children or their legal representatives.

I bind 3rd I give and bequeath to my daughter Anna the sum of one hundred dollars to be laid out by my Executor for a negro girl slave, which negro girl is to be purchased and freely enjoyed by my said daughter Anna together with her increase shall immediately descend to the heirs of her body but should she die without heirs of her body then said negro girl and her increase shall revert to my estate and shall then be equally divided between all my children or their legal representatives.
