

Last Will and Testaments of James H. Pate Dec'd.

In the name of God Amens I James H. Pate of the County of White and State of Tennessee being in full health but of perfect mind and disposing mind and memory thanks be given unto God, calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make constitute and ordain this my last will and testament, that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial neither doubting but at the general resurrection I shall recover the same again by the mighty power of God. And as relates to and touching such mortal estate wherein and wherewithal it has pleased god to bless me well in this life I give and devise as a disposition of the same in the following manner and form First I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate by my executors herein after named out of the first monies that may come to their hands after my death to be raised by sale of property in any other way that may seem to them most convenient and prudent.

I give and bequeath to Mary M. Pate my dearly beloved wife all and every part and parcel of my personal and real estate, consisting of lands and tenements that I may die seized and possessed of in every way whatever including my house bed and kitchen furniture, farming tools and utensils, my stock of horses, cattle hogs sheep &c except one Brown Mare macock, which I give to sell and dispose of the same as she in her discretion may deem necessary to be sold for the main maintenance of her and my family who may live with her and who are minors under the age of twenty one years. She my wife being to care for her own property and the care of my minor son (Lafayette H. Pate) I command H. Pate all the rents and profits that may accrue to them in any way whatever until he shall attain the age of twenty one, and my wife Mary shall remain my widow. And I desire that my executors shall pay to each of my sons to wit Lafayette H. Pate and Niemophil F. Pate Fifty dollars each in property that is to say, that immediately after my death the said Lafayette H. Pate can to have this fifty dollars in property and H. Niemophil F. Pate to be paid his fifty dollars on his arriving at the age of twenty one years. I further direct and desire that the balance of my now children have

Elijah and H. Offen, Priscilla A. Mathews, John A. Pate & Catherine B. Nichols be charged by executors herein before named with the sum of Fifty dollars each, which they have had and received I hereby and authorise to sell and dispose of all and any lands which I may die seized and possessed of in the state of Georgia, Virginia and state of Tennessee with the exception of my farm on Cherry Creek and that may sole by the consent of my executors under an order of the Court. I so further direct and desire that should my dear wife Mary think proper in her judgment to change her way of living by marriage, then and in that case my executors shall and they are hereby specifically required and directed to give our property her with one third of my estate that may be then or hereafter in their possession and disposed to her and to her own use and benefit during her natural life, at her death as much as she may then have or have it to be equally divided amongst my children.

I give and bequeath to my son Lafayette H. Pate my Brown mare which Mary and he to pay my executors herein after named Ten dollars and after

the death of my wife all my property is to be equally divided between my children and the heirs of them bears especially Priscilla & Elijahs children born of her body. And I do hereby strictly declare, rectify and desannul all and every other former Testaments Wills and legacies by me in any wise before made, hereby ratifying this and no other to my last will and testament.

Lastly I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint Stephen Postle and Mary M. Pate my executors to this my last will and testament hoping they will take upon themselves the burthen and see that this my last will and testament shall be carried into effect. Nuncupative Will of James Walling Sealed Dec. 1.

Mr Daniel Walling and Thomas Walling Do state that the Nuncupative Will of James Walling was made by him on the 1st day of October 1849 in our presence to which we were specially required to bear witness by the Testator himself in the presence of each other, that it was made in his last illness in his own habitation or dwelling house and where he had resided for years past, and the same is as follows to wit. It was his wish and desire that his effects should be disposed of after his decease in the following manner. And I also give unto him said Riga all the stock that is on hand after the above named sum and paid consisting of Horses Cattle hogs and sheep and the increase thereof provided he the said Riga remains with me and takes care of me as long as it pleases God to let me live. he also is to have one part of plowing gear, One plow, One Hoe, and one fallowing ax, also he is to have all of the proceeds that is made on the farm from this time also all of the spun thread of all kinds that is on hand if any - also all the cloth that is not made up also of clothing property my son Riga is to have the Money and property as set forth I further request that my land and negro woman Susannah, house bed and Kitchen furniture, working Tools and a Santa. articles be sold my Land to be sold on a credit from one year to six and half and good security and a lien upon the land and property for my negro woman and the other above named property on a credit of twelve months without bond and good security - the effects of the land, negro woman and all the above named property sold to be equally divided between my six and twelve children, Nancy, Curtis, Lucy, Cyburn, Bennett, John O. and Riga - And I further this my two sons Davis Walker and Cyburn Walker executors to this my last will and testament witness I have this minute set my hand and seal this twenty fifth day of August A.D. 1846.
