

Last Will and Testament of James H. Pope Dec^d

In the name of God Amen. I James H. Pope of the County of White and State of Tennessee being in full health but of perfect sound and disposing mind and memory thanks be given unto God, Calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make constitute and ordain this my last will and testament, that is to say, principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God. And as to what to and touching such mortal estate whereunto it has pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give and devise and dispose of the same in the following manner to-wit:

First I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate by my executors hereinafter named out of the first monies that may come to their hands after my death to be raised by sale of property in any other way that may seem to them most advisable and prudent.

2^d I give and bequeath to Henry M. Pope my dearly beloved wife all and every part and parcel of my personal and real estate, consisting of land and improvements that I may do seize and possess of in every way whatever including my house and kitchen furniture, farming tools and implements, my stock of horses, cattle, hogs, sheep &c except on three years' notice, with full power to sell and dispose of the same as she in her discretion may deem necessary to be sold for the maintenance of her and my family who may live with her and who are minors under the age of twenty one years. She my wife Henry to use for her own proper use and the use of my minor son (Frank) Nunnant D. Pope all the rents and profits that may accrue to them in any way whatever until he shall arrive at the age of twenty one, And my wife Henry shall remain my widow. And I desire that my executors shall pay to each of my sons to-wit, Lafayette M. Pope and Nunnant D. Pope, fifty dollars each in property that is to say, that immediately after my death the said Lafayette M. Pope are to have this fifty dollars in property, and Nunnant D. Pope to be paid his fifty dollars on his arriving at the age of twenty one years. I further direct and desire that the balance of my dear children's trust by executor M. Offens, Priscilla M. Mathews, John D. Pope & Catherine D. Mathews be charged by executor hereinafter named with the sum of fifty dollars each, which they have had and received. I hereby and authorize to sell and dispose of all and any land which I may do seize and possess of in the State Georgia, Virginia and State of Tennessee with the exception of my farm on Cherry Creek and that may sold by the consent of my executors under an order of the Court. I do further devise and direct that should my dear wife Henry think proper in her free will to change her way of living by marrying, then and in that case my executors shall and they are hereby specially requested and desired to give and possess her with one third of my estate that may be then on hand in their possession and disposed to be her and to her own use and benefit during her natural life, at her death all such as she may then have on hand to be equally divided amongst my children.

I give and bequeath to my son Lafayette M. Pope my Brown saddle and bridle and he to pay my executors hereafter named Ten dollars and after

the death of my wife all my property is to be equally divided between my children and the heirs of their heirs especially Priscilla M. Mathews children born of her body. And I do hereby utterly disavow, revoke and disannul all and every other former Testament Wills and bequests by me in any wise hitherto made, hereby ratifying this and no other thing last made and testament.

Lastly I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint Stephen Postle and Mary M. Pope my executors to this my last will and testament hoping they will take upon themselves the burthen and see that this my last will and testament shall be carried into effect. In testament whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal the 20th day of July A.D. 1847.

Thirdly. I have five children by a former wife Sarah, Elizabeth, Mary, Jonathan Sarah and Daniel the last named children have long since received from me a just proportion of my estate, therefore exclude them from participating in or from receiving any part of my estate which I may now die seized of. I hereby particularly direct that no security is to be required to be given by said wife Mary for carrying out this my last will and testament.

Nuncupative Will of James Walling Senr Decr.

We Daniel Walling and Thomas Walling Do state that the Nuncupative Will of James Walling was made by him on the 14th day of October 1849 in our presence to which we were specially required to bear witness by the Testator himself in the presence of each other, that it was made in his last sickness in his own habitation or dwelling house and when he had reason for years past, and the terms is as follows to wit: It was his will and desire that his effects should be disposed of after his decease in the following manner. First that Daniel Walling and Thomas Walling sell one tract of land containing Thirty Three acres and four rods of horse land, one yoke of Oxen and some other cattle, and about five hundred bushels of corn, and small lot of stock hogs and some other articles about the place too tedious to mention. And when the money is collected, divide it equal between six of my heirs namely First the Children of William Roberts and his wife Sarah Roberts, Second Daniel Walling—Third the Children of Jesse Walling and Nancy Walling Fourth Cyren Pentecost and his wife Susan, and the Children of Samuel Pentecost and his wife Phoebe— and finally the Children of James Walling. I give and bequeath unto my son Rige Walker further Ten and a fourth part of equal value to those already given to my other Children, and I also give unto him said Rige all the stock that is on hand after the above named ~~sum~~ are paid consisting of Horses Cattle hogs and sheep and the increase thereof provided he the said Rige remains with me and takes care of me so long as it please God to let me live. He also is to have one part of plowing gear, one yoke, one hoe, and one falling ax, also he is to have all of the proceeds that is made on the farm from this time also all of the spend the rest of all kind that is on hand if any—also all the stock that is not made up also if I sell any property my son Rige is to have the money said property is sold for. I further request that my land and negro woman Susan, her household and kitchen furniture, working Tools and similar articles be sold my land to be sold on a credit from one year to six and her and goa being and a kind upon the land until paid for. My Negro woman and the other above named property on a credit of twelve months and bond and good security. The effects of the land, negro woman and all the above named property sold to be equally divided between my ~~children~~ children, Nancy, Curtis, Lucy, Cyren, Bennett, John C. and Rige. And I further give my two sons Curtis Walker and Cyren Walker executors to this my last Will and Testament which I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty fifth day of August. 1846.
