be coming to my said two daughters to them in
such a manner as necessity may require so that my
said daughters may be benefitted by the same my
executors are to keep the principal at interest and
at the death of either of my aforesaid daughters
the estate to be equally divided between the heirs
of said deceased daughters that is what should be
coming to said Daughters part and it is my desire
that should either of their husbands die before
my daughters, that my executor pay over to my
widowed daughters all the estate in their hands
which may be due her my intention is to prevent
my son-in-law the Hodges from having the control
of any part of my estate given to my two daughters
as their heirs.

3^d I give to my son John S. Watson in addition
to the land heretofore given him all the land I own
in the County of Putnam and also the sum of Two
hundred dollars and if he should die without issue
the property to revert to my heirs.

4th I give to my son Benjamin B. H. Watson a tract
of land containing about 80 acres including the

Lawyer a whom said Watson now lies he having a deed to
the same. I desire that my said son Benjamin shall be
equally share in my land, and I think the land heretofore
and be of sufficient value to make his parts equal.

5th I give to my son Thomas J. Watson a tract of land
of 100 acres known by the name of the Dr. Poy or Steady
and all the land South east of said Poy or Steady

6th I give to my unfortunate daughter Mary Allen the
tract of land known by the name of the Dr. Poy or Steady
tract containing 100 acres to be managed by executors
and applied to her support and the support of her
Children and after the death of my daughter Mary, the
property to go to the heirs of her body and if at any
time she may recover from her said affliction then
my said Executors shall give to my said daughter
the full control of said land or if she become dissatisfied
with my executors and the County Court may think she
is in her proper mind, to choose a Guardian then they

7th I give to my daughter Miriam M. Murphy one
hundred and thirty dollars about 11 years old which is
to go out of her part of my estate at her husband's

payment of all my just debts, that the proceeds be equally
