This settlement was commenced 24<sup>th</sup> June 1854, and completed this day. I have allowed the adm<sup>r</sup> to retain for her services by order of the Court, three hundred dollars. She has sold the Negro boy Wilson for \$1100 and received \$500 of the proceeds and filed a bill in Chancery to confirm the sale. She has not accounted for the rents of the negro house. The debt is doubtful or bad, nor has she accounted for any of the partnership debts due Prof. Dingle. She reports them all bad & in dispute. Leaving the above balance of \$2241.83 due to the adm<sup>r</sup> for her services, all of which is respectfully submitted to the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Court for confirmation this 27<sup>th</sup> Sept. 1854.
