That is to say 1st That my Executors herein after named (inim) shall provide for my body a decent burial, suitable to the wishes of my relations and friends, and pay all funeral expenses, together with my just debts, burials or to themselves owing out of the moneys that may first come into her hands as a part or parcel of my Estate, Item 1st I give and devise to my only daughter Samantha Catharine England and the heirs of her body all my estate both real and personal, Consistory of my undivided interest in and to the lands that Walter Walker my father died seized and possessed of I being the one half of said land, also the one half of all the personal property that the said Deceased possessed at the time of his death also the one half of all the money and debts owing to said Deceased at the time of his death.

Item 2^d I further give and devise to said Mary Samantha Catharine England all my own personalities Consistory of the following Items Seven head of Cattle, one bay Mare near three years old. One set of Blacksmith Tools, Some farming tools, Saws, beads, beads and furniture One woman and Saddle, two Sown & Gears, and other whid and N. W. furniture One Dozen Sitting Chairs One Chest

Item 3^d And when my only daughter Mary Samantha Catharine England is a Minor, of the age of Six years and will not arrive at the full age of Seventy and until November 1872 the 11th day. Now therefore my will and desire is that my Mother Catharine Walker is hereby constituted and appointed Guardian of this my only child to have and to hold the custody and guardianship both of her person and estate until she the said Mary S. England shall arrive at the full age of Twenty and years.

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my dear beloved Mother Catharine Walker my lawful Executrix to all intents and purposes to execute the my last Will and Testament, according to her own best Judgment hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and Testaments by me heretofore made.

William Jareds Will

I William Jared do hereby make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and making void all other wills by me at any time made. First I direct that after my funeral expenses, all my just debts be paid, as soon after my death as possible out of any money that I may die possessed of or that may first come into the hands of my Executors. My principal debt and a note in the Branch Bank of Tennessee at Spartanburg three hundred and eighty two dollars, endorsed by Joseph T. and John Jared, and falls due about the 19th July 1861. This note I wish renewed by paying ten per cent call at maturity, or when it falls due, and as soon as the distributive share of my wife, in her part of the same estate is received by my Executors this note paid out. I also executed a note to J. B. Beckwith for four hundred dollars due on the 1st day of January 1861. This note has a credit of ten dollars on it. This note I wish paid as soon as the money on a note of three hundred dollars with a credit on it of seventy dollars on the book-keeper Webb and thus is paid to my Executors. I also made a note to J. B. Beckwith for one hundred dollars and 1st day January 1862, bearing interest from 1st January 1861. This note I wish paid before it falls due. There last two notes

I wish paid as above, provided a negro woman named Phoebe, for which they were given does not prove to be packly or unwound in some way. In that event I wish my Executors to take the necessary legal steps to recover damages for the importation. I am owing J. D. Spring Six dollars due 1st March 1861. I have an account in Saffershire Store for some fifteen or twenty dollars, an account at Wells store for a small amount. Also Waman Clark for some sawing, after deducting two dollars he is owing me. Besides this, I do not remember any just debts that I owe, should there be, I want them paid, all of which I have notes and accounts sufficient to pay.

Secondly. After paying my debts, I will sell my property of every description consisting of lands, negroes, teams, tools and all other singular of which I may possess, when I die, to the use of my wife Martha during her natural life, or widowhood, to support her to raise and school my children, with the following conditions, or in the following manner, - I wish Robert to go to school two whole years, and study the English and natural sciences, with Algebra, Geometry and plain trigonometry necessary to understanding the art of scientific Surveying. Then I wish him to stay at home and let John go to school the same length of time, and study the same Science. Then for him to come home and let Thomas go as a seaman and so on. I desire that each of my sons receive the same amount of schooling. I wish Sarah to have schooling equal to the amount for each boy, or have her amount of pocket she feels to get in schooling allowed to her in the form of a balance. Also the same with Eliza and Mary as near as possible.

Thirdly. I wish my Executors as soon as may be thought for the best to sell either privately, or otherwise, in the manner they may think best for my wife and children all such stock and tools as may not be needful in supporting my family schooling my children - I also wish them to purchase my Negro boy Charles for two or three years to be when the age of six and ten years, also my Negro woman Phoebe for a young negro girl, or if they can effect the same by selling and buying, I wish it done; as to the terms of doing this I leave to the discretion of my Executors, they at the same time consulting with my wife Martha. I also wish them to sell my land on the Cumberland Mountain, so far as possible and to the best advantage.

Fourthly. Should my wife Martha marry before my youngest child comes of age then I wish my Executors to see all my personal and real estate and on a credit of twelve months and distribute the proceeds equally among my wife and children, they my Executors acting as Guardians to my minor

children according to law and paying over to them their contributions share as they become of age.

Fifthly. Should my wife Martha die before my youngest child comes of age, then I wish my Executors to provide as in case of her marrying.

Sixthly. Should my wife live and remain a widow till my youngest child comes of age, and should my wife or I desire a distribution of my estate, then I wish my Executors to set apart one third of all my lands, tenements, the house and premises for the present part of my wife, and to give her one servant to wait on her, and to give her such other property as may be needful for her support and support, to be used for the above object during her natural life. And to see the balance on a credit of twelve months, and pay over the proceeds to my children according to their respective claims. And at the death of my wife I wish the land and property set apart for her to be sold and distributed.

Seventhly. I do hereby appoint and nominate my worthy friends Richard Maulden and John W. Jett my Executors in and of Whom I do, to this my Will and my hand and seal the 29th day of January 1861

Last Will and Testament of George Poise

The following is my last Will and Testament, written this 18th day of September by Broomfield & Hoyle in the eighty third year of my life. I am very feeble in health but I feel and believe that my mind is sound and that I am entirely capable of making a small Will. In the first place I make the following provisions for my wife Polly Poise (Vrs) I give her all my household and kitchen furniture of every description, together with such plantation utensils as in her estimation are necessary to cultivate the farm hereafter to be allowed to her, also I wish her to have two work mules, a mare & Colt what cows and young cattle she may want to keep, including a Yoke of Oxen. also I wish her to have all the following hogs on hand together with such stock hogs as she may wish to keep, also all the Bacon or Pork and family provisions of every kind on hand at my death - also I wish her to have all the wheat, corn fodder &c &c and all the hives on hand. I also give to my beloved wife Polly hundred Dollars in Cash out of the first money collected by

by my Executors I give all the above property to my wife absolutely to the use of amongst my Children and Grand Children as she chooses

In addition to the above I give to my wife Polly Price the homed place where I now live including the houses, outhouses, orchards &c during the term of her natural life and at her death to be divided amongst my heirs at law and distributed as heretofore mentioned

I wish my Executors hereafter appointed to assign by actual survey as much land of the Home tract to my wife as may be sufficient for her most comfortable maintenance and they will allow to her a sufficient quantity of Rail timber and firewood

Further it is my will and deed that all the real and mixed of my estate both real and personal or mixed, debts due or to be owed due, after the payment of my debts shall be equally divided between my Children I do not intend that my Grand Children shall have any part of my land, (But I order) and appoint that my Executors should pay over to each one of my Grand Children whose father or mother is dead at this time and who may be alive at my death (Except James Potest and Samuel Potest and Polly Cook who shall receive nothing of my Estate) the sum of One hundred dollars each in full of their respective claims

I also except Mamon Price, I don't intend for him to have a share of my estate

Further I give Limas and Puff and her present and future income to my wife during her life time, and at her death to be divided amongst my Children as above provided

As to the residue of my estate I hereby appoint my son or law George F Hampton and Lorenzo D Price my Executors and require them faithfully to execute the provisions of this Will this the day and year given and written by the testator

It is now my design and wish to provide for my beloved wife Amy Hunter and all the children which she has or may have by me she shall have property and money out of my estate share and share alike by Amy to have a child's part until she and her children shall each be made equal in amount with each of my three children above named which I have appointed off.
