In the presence of the Almighty God, and those surrounding people, I make this my last Will and Testament, revoking all other former Wills. Item 1st I want all of my just debts paid if there is enough to pay them. Item 2^d, I want all of my landed estate sold on one and 2 years credit, with interest from date except my part of the Belark land that I gave him on, I want the timber equally divided between the Currick land and the Belark land, in the selling of the Currick land, I want one half of the timber given with the Currick land, and the balance to go with the Belark land. I want all of my personal property also sold, except 2 chairs, head of horse, Stock, and 2 chairs, cows and calves, and the flock of sheep and hogs, that are my wife and my need. I want my wife, Orange Scott to have the farm, that is the Belark part as long as she may live and every thing else on the proceeds thereof, to have and to hold and to dispose of as she may see proper at her death or any other time, except \$500 Three Hundred Dollars I want my daughter Elizabeth Paul to have to aid her in schooling and raising her children, It is my request that that sum to be out of the Central of her husband John McPaul, Also I want my daughter Louella Trustor to have \$500 Three Hundred Dollars to aid her in schooling her 2 boys, Robert Trustor and James Scott Trustor, if there should be sufficient funds after paying debts. If there be sufficient funds without selling the remainder of the land, if not they must wait till their mother can pay it. In case I should have any good Watch on hand at my death I want Lou Trustor to keep it till James Scott Trustor arrives at the age of 21 years and one day.

It to him, I appoint S. S. Pitman and Waman Black Executors to my Will, with full power to wind up my estate, this the first day of April 1881.
