



State of Sumner or Williamson County. On the 1st the undersigned Commissioners appointed by the most respectable Court of the County of Williamson at the 10th 1803. Upon the said Court for the purpose of dividing the lands of Hardy Marquise deceased, however his heirs equally to an lot of the several apparently bearing date October 12th 1782. do hereby report that we have in substance to the said order proceeded to value & make the divisions apportioned in manner and form following.
