Hardeman & Harriet Sarah J. & Hardeman said negroes were valued by us at the sum of twenty two hundred twenty dollars twelve of different values each were not sufficiently numerous to admit of numerical division among said heirs & widow we have therefore appropriated said negroes in the following manner to wit we have assigned to Ann Hardeman widow of said Nicholas P. Hardeman the said negro slave Isabella valued at the sum of five hundred twenty five dollars we have awarded that she shall pay to Sarah J. & Hardeman the sum of two hundred eighty three dollars twenty five cents & that she shall also pay to William Hardeman the sum of seven dollars fifty cents & have charged the payment of said sum upon her share we have allotted to Thomas W. Perkins in right of his wife Nancy J. Perkins the said slave Isabella valued at five hundred thirty dollars & have charged this share with the payment to Nancy J. Hardeman of two hundred forty six dollars twenty five cents we have allotted to A. J. Hardeman said slave Ceato valued at four hundred fifty dollars & have charged this share with the payment to A. J. Hardeman of one hundred twenty one dollars twenty five cents we have allotted to Thomas Hardeman said slave Lydia valued at two hundred & thirty five dollars & have charged this share with the payment to Nancy J. Hardeman of seven dollars forty four cents we have allotted to Lavinia C. Hardeman said slave Anna valued at four hundred fifteen dollars and have charged this share with the payment to William Hardeman of one hundred fifteen dollars & with the payment to Nancy J. Hardeman of twenty six dollars and twenty five cents making as we conceive the shares of those who are paid in money respectively equal to the value of the slaves received by the others after deducting the payments with which there are respectively above.


