In pursuance of orders of today, I  
respectfully submit the following report of the operations of this Regt. at  
"Mine Run" - Having received orders to move early in the morning  
of 27th Nov. '63 - it moved that day in the direction of "Crossed Mine Run"  
until the enemy was met. Then 32nd Regt. being in the advance was thrown  
out of the fight of that day, and then fell back on a line with the rest of  
the Corps - It remained in the same place until after dark  
fall - when it, with the rest of the Corps, moved to the right and  
"Crossed Mine Run" - On the 28th it was at its position on the night of  
the 29th, and remained at its position until the morning of 30th, when  
it was ordered back to its former position. Here it remained until the morning of the  
1st Dec. - It then moved to the right with the Corps, and afterwards  
marched towards Germantown Ford. - In the afternoon it started  
back towards "Mine Run" and on the 2nd Dec. reached the Camp  
near "Mine Run" and remained there until the 3rd Dec.
