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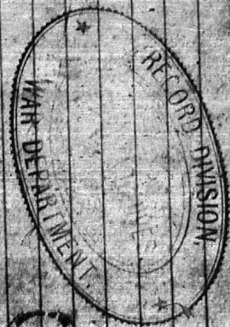

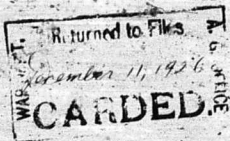

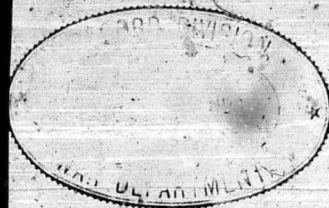

Captain:

In obedience to an order from Genl. Johnson through Genl. Ames on the morning of the 27th. left I went forward to protect on the march the artillery of the Division, and one mile east of Bartlett's miles on the Locust Grove road encountered six regiments of the enemy which after a little skirmish of a few minutes were driven off, without injury to us. I deployed five companies, the right wing of my command to cover both sides of the road, until we reached the pickets of Rodes' Division when they were withdrawn. The Regiment resumed its march and after a few counter-marches until near twelve o'clock I deployed three companies of my Regiment under command of Capt. John M. Anderson's skirmishers and the left of Rodes' Division, which skirmishes moved forward well when the Brigade advanced in line. I took right of the skirmishers of the Brigade at the first opening in the woods upon the crest of which the enemy were posted, and coming in two degrees in their front I found it necessary to de-

ploy twelve men with Lt. H. M. C. Co. upon my right to fill the vacancy between Capt. Johnson and it to protect my flank. It was essential for the line of Maj. Anderson to retire ~~and~~ we drove the enemy out of their position and out for having fallen back to the left of the Brigade and exhibiting the weakness of our flank the open space nearly a half mile between us and Rodes' left we could have hanked them much further. We retired in the skirts of the woods or rather back to the crest of the Hill and upon an order from Capt. Early to the fence we had both crept in advancing, and afterwards marched by the left flank with the Brigade to the main road. As a Capt. captures one (1) prisoner, Co. E, four (4) Capt. Matthews of Co. I, and I thank my officers for their energy, coolness, ~~and~~ gallantry. The men that determine bravery which has made them conspicuous on every battle field. Capt. Rye was severely wounded and my Serjt. Major L. M. Lytton who has more than once been recommended for promotion was again hurt. There was no shelling. My thanks are due to you, Lieut. and a Ty. Major Harper
