CHARLES ISRAEL LORAIN ALLIX, of Swaffham Prior, Cambs, J.P. and D.L., late Lieut. Coldstream Guards (Special Reserve), served in Great War 1914-19, *b.* 1 Dec. 1872; *educ.* Eton and Trin. Coll. Camb., M.A. (1897); *m.* 23 Oct. 1906, Hon. Hilda Strutt (*d.* 28 April, 1923), 3rd dau. of Henry, 2nd Baron Belper (see BURKE'S Peerage), and has issue,

1. PETER LORAIN, *b.* 10 Feb. 1919; *educ.* Eton.

2. Mary Diana, *b.* 18 Sept. 1911.

Lineage—PETER ALLIX, D.D. Camb. (1690), of Alençon, in Normandy, head of the Protestant Church in France, quitted that kingdom (having received the royal permission to do so) at the Revocation of the Edict of Nantes, 1685, and settled in England. A veto was placed on his departure from France as he was preparing to leave; but he had already embarked at Calais when the order to detain him was received there, and subsequent efforts to induce him to return were unsuccessful. Dr. Allix became Treasurer of Salisbury Cathedral. He *m.* 1678, Marguerite, dau. of Jean Roger, of Paris, and *d.* 21 Feb. 1717, leaving a son,

THE VERY REV. JOHN PETER ALLIX, D.D. Camb. (1721), Vicar of Swaffham Prior, Rector of Castle Cambs, Dean of Gloucester 1729, and of Ely 1730; purchased the Swaffham Prior estate in 1751; *m.* Elizabeth, dau. of Alexander Parker, merchant of London, and half-sister and co-heiress of Adm. Sir Charles Wager, First Lord of the Admiralty (1733-42), and *d.* 11 Jan. 1758, leaving a son,

CHARLES ALLIX, of Swaffham, Cambs, acquired the Marsh Chapel estate, Lincs, by devise of his cousin, Mons. de Bouissière, *m.* Catherine, dau. of Right Rev. Thomas Greene, D.D., Bishop of Ely (1723-38), and *d.* 1794, aged 78, leaving issue,

1. Charles Wager (Rev.), of Willoughby Hall, Lincs, M.A. Christ's Coll. Camb., *b.* 18 June, 1748; *m.* Katherine, 2nd dau. of Richard Townley, of Belfield Hall, Lincs, and *d.* 30 Nov. 1795, being *s.* by his eldest son,

Charles, of Willoughby Hall, J.P. and D.L. Lincs, *b.* 20 Jan. 1783; *m.* 3 June, 1808, Mary Elizabeth, 2nd dau. of William Hammond, of St. Alban's Court, Kent, and *d.* 22 Jan. 1866, leaving with other issue (see 1921 *Ediz.*), a son and successor,

Frederick William, of Willoughby Hall, Lincs, J.P. and D.L., formerly Capt. Gren. Guards, *b.* 11 April, 1816; *m.* 30 May, 1844, Sophia Mary (*d.* 16 Sept. 1910), only dau. and heiress of Christopher Henry Neville, afterwards Noel, of Wellingore Hall, Lincs (see that family), and *d.* 13 Oct. 1894, leaving issue, with a dau., Helen Harriet Elizabeth, *m.* 16 July, 1870, Abel Humphry Ram, son of Stephen Ram, of Ramspout, D.L. co. Wexford (see L.G. of Ireland), and *d.* 28 Sept. 1906, a son and successor,

Noel Charles Noel, of Rhiwgreiddyn, Ceinws, Montgomery, previously of Willoughby Hall, Lincs (which he sold), late Col. Gren. Guards, Equerry to the Khedive of Egypt, 1872-75, served in Russo-Turkish War, 1877-8, with the Turkish Army (Orders of the Medjidie and the Osmanieh), J.P. and D.L. for Lincs and Kent, *b.* 15 May, 1846; *educ.* Harrow; *m.* 1st, 11 March, 1871, Helen (*d.* 10 Aug. 1889), dau. of Edwin Taunton, of Bromborough, Cheshire, and by her had issue to survive,

16. Muriel Lilian Helen de Burgh.
