We the jury agree that this is Bozeman Adair's Will tried before Judge Hammond March 1859, Paulding Superior Court. The caveat claims that Bozeman Adair was not of sound mind when he made his will and that he was induced under the influence of James L. Adair and Mitchell S. Adair, principal legatees and sons of the deceased, and that the deceased was extremely weak and imbecile from old age and sickness. The case came on for trial, the appeal from the judgment of the Ordinary, rejecting the paper propounded as the last will and testament of Bozeman Adair, deceased. At the trial, it was proven that at the time the alleged will was executed, deceased was very weak and feeble, and about eighty-six years of age; he spoke very low. The jury found in favor of the will, and counsel for caveators moved for a new trial. Judgment reversed.

HUSBAND - William Adair

William Adair followed the trail of the Scotch-Irish in America, emigrating from Antrim, Ireland to Bucks County, Pennsylvania; thence into the Shenandoah Valley (Augusta County, Virginia) where one smidget of information was discovered. In 1746 William Adair witnessed the LWT of Robert Syers of Pennsylvania. From there, he removed to Fishing Creek which flows through Chester and York Counties, South Carolina to the northwestern side of the Catawba River. William must have arrived there with the main influx of Scotch-Irish coming from Pennsylvania, Maryland and Virginia in 1752. This fact is evidenced by a deed, Chester County, SC Deed Book A, page 387, between William Adair and Mary, his wife, of Camden District, County of Chester and Claudias Charvin...witness that William Adair for the sum of 235 pounds of money paid to him by Claudias Charvin does grant and sell unto said Charvin 280 acres on the South Fork of Fishing Creek, being the western half of the tract of 560 acres granted 29 Mar 1753 to Abraham Kirkendall, all conveyed to William Adair and Mary his wife by the said Abraham Kirkendall dated 15 May 1754. Date of deed: 12 Nov 1787. Note: The April Court of 1789, York County, South Carolina, William Adair vs. Claudius Charvis and Daniel Williams.

Mecklenburg County, NC Deeds, page 589. 14 Dec 1767. William Adear and Mary, his wife, of Anson County to William Moore of same for 94 pounds proclamation money, land adjoining Judith Coqburn, survey granted to Frederick Hambicht 30 Aug 1753 conveyed by Frederick Hambicht and Sarah his wife 28 Sept 1758.

When the NC-SC boundary was established in 1772, the area was considered to be in North Carolina (Anson County, later Mecklenburg and Tryon Counties). During the 1760's three Presbyterian congregations were organized along Upper and Lower Fishing Creek. The Moore's gum-log house was built on Fishing Creek about twenty feet from the water and was often surrounded by water. William Adair's house stood the same way. They faced their homes in this manner as as to be safe from the Cherokees who often waylaid them while going for water or when washing.

At the time of the American Revolution, a group of Americans marched out to find the British. At the home of William Adair, the old man and his wife took hold of their son, John Adair, and detained him by force. But John watched for his chance and ran from them, mounting his horse and overtaking the command. John Adair later went to Kentucky. Fishing Creek Adairs by Mrs. William Peel, Historical Collections of Joseph Habersham Chapter, DAR, pp. 62-3.

William Adear owned "a plantation or tract of land containing 260 acres situate as supposed when run out to be in Tryon County in the Province of North Carolina on the waters of Fishing Creek, joining his own land...Gillispies Corner...joining Thomas Scott's land...Also a plantation or tract of land containing 200 acres situate as supposed above the waters of South Fork of Fishing Creek, joining Robert Kerr's land...James Williamson's Corner...Craft's Corner...Joining McClean's land...both which tracts of land were originally granted by his excellency William Tryon Esquire, the Governor of North Carolina the 4th day of May 1769, the 260 acres to William Watson and the 200 acres to William Bratton, which each conveyed by Deed of Release bearing date of 22d of January 1771 to William Adear the Mem'st...but by a later resurvey of the boundary line by order of his present Majesty the above two tracts of landfall within the province of South Carolina in Craven County...the 10th day of April 1773, delivered 22 Sept 1774 to James Adair." Memorial Book, Vol. 12, page 154, South Carolina State Archives.

"William Adair, a plantation or tract of 250 acres of land in Craven County, bounding N by Edward Lacey's, E by lands laid out, SW by said Adair's land and other sides by vacant land. Survey certified the 16th April and granted the 25th day of April 1774 to the Mem'st...the 6th day of August 1774. Alexander Turner, D. S. delivered 14th Nov 1774 to William Adair." Adair was forced to resign his seat in the Senate, and the negative publicity kept him out of politics for more than a decade.

Adair's participation in the War of 1812 restored his reputation, and he returned to the state House in 1817. His commanding officer in the war, twice governor Isaac Shelby, appointed him adjutant general of the state militia. In 1820, Adair was elected governor on a platform of financial relief for Kentuckians hit hard by the Panic of 1819. His primary measure toward this end was the creation of the Bank of the Commonwealth. Many of his other financial reforms were deemed unconstitutional by the Kentucky Court of Appeals.

Following his term as governor, Adair served one term in the United States House of Representatives, but did not run for re-election. He died May 19, 1840 at his farm in Harrodsburg, Kentucky. He had twelve children, five of them daughters.

CHILD 5 - William Adair

William Adair followed the trail of the Scotch-Irish in America, emigrating from Antrim, Ireland to Bucks County, Pennsylvania; thence into the Shenandoah Valley (Augusta County, Virginia) where one smidgen of information was discovered. In 1746 William Adair witnessed the LWT of Robert Syers of Pennsylvania. From there, he removed to Fishing Creek which flows through Chester and York Counties, South Carolina to the northwestern side of the Catawba River. William must have arrived there with the main influx of Scotch-Irish coming from Pennsylvania, Maryland and Virginia in 1752. This fact is evidenced by a deed, Chester County, SC Deed Book A, page 387, between William Adair and Mary, his wife, of Camden District, County of Chester and Claudias Charvin...witness that William Adair for the sum of 235 pounds of money paid to him by Claudias Charvin does grant and sell unto said Charvin 280 acres on the South Fork of Fishing Creek, being the western half of the tract of 560 acres granted 29 Mar 1753 to Abraham Kirkendall, all conveyed to William Adair and Mary his wife by the said Abraham Kirkendall dated 15 May 1754. Date of deed: 12 Nov 1787. Note: The April Court of 1789, York County, South Carolina, William Adair vs. Claudius Charvis and Daniel Williams.

Mecklenburg County, NC Deeds, page 589. 14 Dec 1767. William Adear and Mary, his wife, of Anson County to William Moore of same for 94 pounds proclamation money, land adjoining Judith Coqburn, survey granted to Frederick Hambicht 30 Aug 1753 conveyed by Frederick Hambicht and Sarah his wife 28 Sept 1758.

When the NC-SC boundary was established in 1772, the area was considered to be in North Carolina (Anson County, later Mecklenburg and Tryon Counties). During the 1760's three Presbyterian congregations were organized along Upper and Lower Fishing Creek. The Moore's gum-log house was built on Fishing Creek about twenty feet from the water and was often surrounded by water. William Adair's house stood the same way. They faced their homes in this manner as to be safe from the Cherokees who often waylaid them while going for water or when washing.

At the time of the American Revolution, a group of Americans marched out to find the British. At the home of William Adair, the old man and his wife took hold of their son, John Adair, and detained him by force. But John watched for his chance and ran from them, mounting his horse and overtaking the command. John Adair later went to Kentucky. Fishing Creek Adairs by Mrs. William Peel, Historical Collections of Joseph Habersham Chapter, DAR, pp. 62-3.
