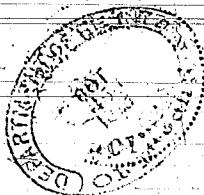

On this 25th day of August 1834 personally appeared in open Court, before Charles Dougherty, presiding Judge of the Superior Court of said County now sitting John Bradley, a resident of the State & County aforesaid aged 75 years who being first duly sworn according to law doth as his oath make the following amendments to his declaration made on the third of June 1833 in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7th 1833

He states that he can not be more explicit in his first tour marked No 1 in the Margin of his original declaration - then he states that he entered the service as a private volunteer in February 1776 under Captain M^c Fadden in North Carolina Rutherford County, marched to ^{a settlement that} ~~Crook Creek~~ under Col. Gray-horn against the Scotch ~~who~~ were unfriendly to the ~~American~~ ^{cause} & was in that service 40 days - Another can be more explicit as to his second tour marked No 2 - In his third tour marked No 3 he states that the corps called the Rangers were an authorized body of troops by the State sworn raised to keep the Tories & Indians in check & while in this service he was embodied with the Company under the Command of Capt Cook & that he was constantly in the field or garrison & in no other employment or business other than served the three months fully - He commenced this tour directly after the expiration of the last mentioned one & he means when he says it ended in 1778 that it terminated ⁱⁿ the first of that year to wit, in the month of July before he got home.

That in his 4th tour marked No 4 he is certain of serving the three months under Capt Jrd Potts & was constantly engaged the whole time in guarding the frontiers of North Carolina & building the fort called Fort Hampton & engaged in no other business

He is only uncertain as to the time when it commenced but now thinks it was in 1777 because he believes it was not very long after the expiration of his last mentioned tour - That he now believes his fifth ^{marked off} tour, which commenced in the early part of 1788 & his reason for so believing are these that all his tours followed one another shortly after each other with but a short stay at home for the outrages of the Tories were such that the Rangers were compelled to be constantly embodied & their places supplied at the end of three months tours in order to protect the settlements of frontiers, indeed there was little or no safety but in a state of scouting & encampment - There appears to be no uncertainty in his sixth tour but the year - as to the ^{duration} of the service, the officers, the skirmishes, the nature of the service they are explicit & he is positive as to all but the year - He can not think this should deprive him of his right. With regard to his seventh tour in order to be more explicit as to the time of its commencement he begs to refer the Pension Commissioner to the battle of Kings Mountain & it was not longer than two weeks before that event that he entered upon this tour & his services were constant & the company in which he was embodied were employed in marching through the upper part of South Carolina against the Tories particularly on the Proctor & Tiger rivers.

In his last tour started Nov 8th he went under Capt Gray & Major Singleton as a private against the Indians & was out fifteen days - this was an expedition against the Indians on the frontiers of North Carolina & they killed five Indians.

To the question propounded by the Court the answer,

To the 1st He was born in Beaufort County, now Warren County North Carolina & in the year 1759.

To the 2^d He has no record there was one but it is lost. He however has kept his age from early traditions.

To the 3^d He was living when called into service in Rutledge County.

North Carolina & lived there during the whole revolutionary war -
Since that time or rather in five years after the termination of the war
I moved to Forsyth County Georgia & lived in the County of Jackson
where I now live I have resided ever since

To the 4th He was a volunteer in every tour for he considered
himself more safe in the army than at home, such was
the cruel and depredations of the Indians & Tories.

To the 5th I have mentioned all the officers that I know as
were as the survey performed

To the 6th He never had any written discharge that he knows
of

To the 7th He refers to Isaac Brown the Hon. A. Clayton Sylva-
nus Ripley, Clerk of the Court & Henry Lowry Esq. S. R.
