The Bullock Family

Written by Sally Hamilton Bullock
Boyd in 1900.

This family is a very old one, being one of the early Colonial families, and the name is often found in Parish Registers and in other documents both in Wales and England.

"As early as 1434 the name of John Bullock occurs among those returned as 'gentlemen' of Norfolk, England."

"In 1617 another John Bullock left a donation to the Parish of Shipdham." "Burkes Landed Gentry" says "The family of Bullock has possessed land in the parishes of Yeovil and Coker for centuries."

In Essex, too, some of the name were found, and at one time Lieut. Col. Jonathan Bullock was M.P. from Essex. It has not yet been ascertained when the first of the name came to the New World, but in 1676 when Sir William Berkley was Gov. of Virginia, there was a young lieutenant, who, it is said was a member of his staff.

His christian name and where he came from are not known certainly, but it is supposed that he came from Wales. After Bacon's patriotic championship of the people of Virginia had accomplished its purpose, Lieut. Bullock resigned his commission and settled in Caroline Co. Va. From there his descendants have scattered to many parts of the U.S., and they are found today in Virginia, North Carolina, Georgia, Texas, Arkansas, Missouri, Kentucky, and Tennessee.

There was, a Dr. Bullock Chaplain of Congress at one time who said (he was from Kentucky I think) he was kin to the Bullocks of Granville.

Richard Bullock was the first of this Granville branch to settle in the county and he died here in 1764. It is not known whether he was a son or grandson of Lieut. Bullock of Caroline Co. Va., and his wife's name was Ann Henley. His children were:

- * (Zachariah Bullock never married but went with sister, who married John Nuckolls to S.C., Mr. Nuckolls was killed in the early part of the Revolutionary War by a Tory, and Zachariah helped his sister care for a large family.)

Len Henley Bullock, son of Richard, together with Harry Lyne and Col. Richard Henderson formed what is known as the Kentucky Land Company or the Transylvania Land company. They bought of the Cherokee Indians a very extensive and rich tract of country, which embraced much of what is now Tennessee and Kentucky. "The treaty by which the purchase was made was concluded, in March 1775 on the banks of the Watauga river at a council, at which Daniel Boone was present. "The purchase was declared void by the states of Virginia and North Carolina, but each state afterward gave two hundred thousand acres in lieu of that which had been purchased. (See University Magazine for 1859). Col. Richard Henderson was the manager for this company (He was also Judge under the crown) and he seemed, from what can be learned, active and faithful in the performance of his duties, but in the confusion of the times after the Revolutionary War other people moved in and settled up the land, that neither the original company nor their descendants ever received much benefit from the venture.

Early in the 19th century Mr. John Bullock, a grandson of Len Henley Bullock took all the papers bearing on this case, and went out to Tennessee to learn whether anything could be recovered for the heirs.

After consultation with the Governor of the state, and others acknowledged the validity of the claims, he decided that the necessary lawsuits would eat up his property, and last his life-time, with the probability that he would have nothing in the end to pay him for his trouble and expense.

He very wisely, therefore, destroyed all the papers, and thus no one else has been tempted to start a suit that would probably last and end like Jarndyce in Jarndyce.

Len Henley Bullock married in 1760 Fannie daughter of Philemon Hawkins, she dying, he married in 1766 Susan Goodloe (nee Martin). Their children were:

Fannie, married James Lyne.

Susan, married Jno. Taylor (called Brandy) in 1784.

Lucy, married William Bullock.

Nancy, married James Bullock.

Agnes, married Dr. John Hare.

Richard, married Ann Maria Martin (His mother's niece).

The children of Fannie Lyne were, George, Henry, Len Henley, and Lucy Ann who married James Boyd. Len Henley Bullock had one step-daughter who married a Somerville, her name was Mary Goodloe. Agnes daughter of Agnes Bullock and John Hare married Wm. Farrar Henderson.

Susan Bullock who married John Taylor (called Brandy) lived at Jessamin Cot. They had two children John C. and James. James married Mary Eaton (sister of Col. Chas. and the rascal Phos.) and their children were Agnes, married James Alexander Bullock. Susan, married Britton and Fontaine, a Texas Ranger and Episcopal clergyman, a man of high literary ability. His son Lamar Fontaine was a noted Confederate Scout who after being severely wounded used to run the blockade on his crutches when Vicksburg was invested. This Lamar Fontaine wrote "All quiet along the Potomac tonight." Mr. Jas. Bullock said he saw the poem in the rough when Lamar brought it to his father to have him polish it up. Bettie married 1st Philip Thomas, 2nd Col. John Wimble.

John C. Taylor married Miss Tillinghast, their children John Tillinghast-Vestry-man and lay-reader at St. Johns Church Capt. of the Townsville Guards was killed early in the war; Ollie married Kate Lewis Bullock; James married Victoria Moore, a beauty. Sue Taylor, Eliza Taylor, and Caroline Taylor all died unmarried.

John C. and James H. Taylor had a sister Elizabeth married Dr. Phil. Hungerford Thomas of Caswell Co. Agnes married James Somerville of Warrenton. Mary married Williams of Warrenton their son John Taylor Williams two daughters Rebecca Williams, and Sue Williams. Catharine Williams married Chambliss-three sons John, Peter and Jackson (who was drowned) Mr. Chambliss rescued his wife from a burning ship. Sue Williams was engaged to Dr. Dudley and lost her mind when he died, she died in an asylum.

Annie Bullock, a daughter of Richard Bullock and Miss Martin married Archibald Henderson his brother. (viz, Wm. Farrar Henderson's brother).

Col. William Bullock, son of Richard Bullock married Elizabeth Lewis, widow of James Lewis, and daughter of Jno. Taylor and Catharine Pendleton. John Taylor was the son of Jas. Taylor and Mary Gregory. Jas. Taylor came from Carlisle England to Caroline Co. Va. in 1682. Catharine Pendleton was a daughter of Philip Pendleton of Norwich England, he came to Caroline Co. Virginia in 1676 and died in 1721. Elizabeth Taylor by her first marriage was the mother of James Lewis and John Lewis.

The children of Col. William Bullock and Elizabeth his wife were

Col. William Bullock died in 1796, his widow Elizabeth in 1816.

Agnes married 2nd Judge John Williams 1759 and was the mother of Agatha, who married, Col. Robert Burton. Judge John Williams was the founder of the town of Williamsboro, which was one of the Post-towns between Millsboro and the coast. It is in that part of Vance County which was a part of Granville, and about ten or twelve miles from the Virginia line. The place which Judge Williams owned and when he had a law school is now, in 1900, owned by Richard Austin Bullock. The house which stood there, was burned August 4, 1864 about fifteen years ago. It was the house that was built and occupied by Judge Williams, and though it was as solid and strong when it was built. It was noted for its beautiful hall, with an arch, wainscoting up to the ceiling and for its beautiful stairway with a handsomely carved balustrade. The place is called Montpelier and in the burying ground on the plantation are the graves of Col. Robert Burton and his wife Agatha; (Col. Burton was a Revolutionary officer) of Mary wife of James Hamilton and daughter of Francis and Bromfield Ridley; of John Williams Burton, of Judge Williams and his wife. There are others marked by stones but without inscription and others without even a stone. Judge Leonard Henderson one of the first Chief Justices of N. C. is but there but at his own request the grave is not marked in any way. Richard Henderson who married Elizabeth Keeling, was a son of Samuel Henderson, Sheriff of Granville Co. and Elizabeth Williams (a sister of Judge John). The children of Richard Henderson and Elizabeth Keeling his wife were:

Mrs. Susanna Jiggetts lived to a good old age, being more than eighty
years old when she died. She was noted for the gentle dignity of her
manners, for her cheery faith and for her devotion to her church. She

outlived all her brothers and sisters, tho' she was the oldest child.

Elizabeth, second child of William and Lucy Bullock, married Richard Inge Dec. 17, 1812 and died in 1815, leaving an infant son William Bullock Inge, who was reared by his grandmother. He was a talented man and took a high stand in his classes at the University. He was fond of cultured society and entertained a good deal, but as he was very hot-tempered and tyrannical he was not very popular in his family. He married a Miss Hemdon, who was celebrated in the family for her beautiful needle work. They moved to Green Co., Ala. and left many descendants.

William H., third child of William and Lucy Bullock, married Panthea Burchette of Virginia, and their children were; William, Lucy, Ann, Panthea, James, Nicholas Merriweather and Richard Thomas Reade. William a promising young man who had just finished his medical course in a Philadelphia college, died before he ever practiced his profession. Lucy left no descendants. Panthea married Dr. William Baltyell of Green Co., Alabama. James married Miss Anna Mary Garrow of Mobile and left one daughter Virginia Garrow, who married George Willis. William H. Bullock and his wife Panthea moved to Green Co., Alabama in 1832.

He and his nephew William Bullock Inge lived in the same county, but the nephew's taste were all for a showy life. He was fond of dress, fine horses, good wine and society, while the uncle had more simple tastes. He was of a kind and genial nature and the nephews who remember him always speak of him with affection. There seems from the letters handed down to have been very little intercourse between the two families, (that is of the uncle and nephew). John, fourth child, of William and Lucy Bullock married Susan Cobb, daughter of the Rev. Jesse H. Cobb and Olivia Bridgen his wife. Jesse H. Cobb was the son of Jesse Cobb and Elizabeth Heritage. Elizabeth Heritage was a daughter of William Heritage and Susanna Franks of New Berne, Jesse Cobb's father emigrated from Holland to Jamestown Va. and he was descended from a young Scotchman who was, at the University of Oxford England at the same time that Sir Walter Raleigh was there. After graduation young Cobb was one of 100 gentleman horsemen permitted by Queen Elizabeth to fight for the Protestant cause on the Continent of Europe in Henry Campermon's troop. After the "Pacification of Ghent 1576", he married a pretty Dutch girl named Sibyl Shirts and settled in Holland. From them was descended the Cobb who came to Jamestown. This information was obtained from the Rev. Needham Bryan Cobb, D.D. of Sampson Co. N. C.

John Bullock and his wife, Susan Cobb, lived at Williamsboro together for 42 years, his widow lived there nearly ten years after his death, or till her death in 1875, and since that time the youngest son, Walter, has occupied the same house.

This couple were specially noted for their piety. Mr. John Bullock was an Elder in Nutbush church (as was his father before him) and it was through his instrumentality that the church was tided over the time of a general exodus from Granville Co. At one time he was the only male member of the church, but by his faithfulness he maintained the organization until more people moved in and the young people grew up. He was most constant in attending the services of his church, several times walking the five miles when the ground would be too frozen for riding to be safe. Sometimes he found only his Pastor there. There was a saying current when he was living; when any one wanted to say a thing would certainly come to pass, they would say it would as certainly be as that "Mr. Jack Bullock would be at Nutbush Sunday."

Lucy O. Bullock married Col. Thos. Gregory, Jan. 5, 1853. Their children were Lucy O., John Lewis, Susan Cobb, and Mabel Thomas. Lucy O. died when a little child, John Lewis died in 1898. Susan Cobb married Jas. Thos. Morton in 1896 and their children were John Gregory and Jas. Thos. She died in 1891 or 1892. Mabel died in 1899.

William Cobb Bullock married Fannie Catharine Daniel April 14, 1853. Their children were:
