

WHERE IS BOHANNAN?

DISAPPEARANCE OF THE SINGER COMPANY'S BOOKKEEPER.

No Trace to He Had as to His Whereabouts - His Accounts With the Company Found to Be Short, Though the Amount is Unknown.

Mr. E. B. Bohannan, who for the past eight months has been in the employ of the Singer Sewing Machine Company, in this city, in the capacity of city book-keeper, left the office last Monday evening, proceeded to his home at No. 20 Cooper street, where he remained, it is supposed, until early the next morning. Since that time nothing has been seen of him, and all efforts to obtain a trace as to his whereabouts have thus far proved unavailing. The fact is ascertained that Mr. Bohannan was short in his accounts with the Singer Company, and that he was otherwise financially embarrassed, though to what extent is not known. Mr. C. G. Lambert, the general agent of the company at this point, was seen by a JOURNAL reporter to day, but he was unable, he stated, to give any definite information touching the matter.

Mr. Bohannan, some years ago, suffered from a sunstroke, and it has since affected his health to a considerable degree. He has often been known to fall suddenly to the floor as though dead, and after lying for a few moments in a comatose condition would recover. His wife states that from this cause he has once or twice before absented himself from home for a few days, wandering off until suddenly coming to his senses he would return again. It is possible that this is the case in this instance, and for the sake of his family and friends it is hoped that it is so.

Mr. Bohannan is better known to many as the organist at St. Luke's Cathedral, he being a musician of considerable ability. As such he has made a great many warm friends, whose surprise will be great when they learn of his disappearance.
