In another part of California, Saratoga, Santa Clara county, two daughters of John Brown are living, Sarah, who was for some years employed in the San Francisco mint, and Ellen (Mrs. Fablinger). These daughters own a fruit farm there which was their mother's, the widow of John Brown, who died nearly two years ago. The other daughter, Anne (Mrs. Adams), is living with her children at Rohnerville, in northern California, and her brother, Salmon, who owns a sheep range and a large flock of sheep, lives at Bridgeville, Humboldt county, not for from Rohnerville. None of the family. are very prosperous in worldly goods.
