John Jones".

Shortly before the Revolutionary War Mr. Thomas Camp moved from Va., to Rutherford, North Carolina and settled Island Ford, on the French Broad River. Here they were buried. He was too old to fight about Supported the Cause for which they were pillaged by the Brittish. Four of his Sons were in the "Battle of King's Mountain." John, Nathaniel and Benjamin, and Thomas".
