

A MONUMENT TO HIS FRIENDS:

This monument was erected by Mark A. Cooper about 1887, on the banks of the Housh River, near the office and rolling-mill, with marble shaft and stone foundation. The top of the shaft has been knocked off and thrown on the opposite side of the road, but the body of the monument, with inscription and names still stands in place, though defaced and battered.
