A letter from the Deputy Clerk of Rutherford County, North Carelina

(Mrs. Annie E. Logan) Apr. 15, 1925 says: "Ratherford County formed in 1779 from Teyon and Burke. The first record of transfer to Thomas Comp was dated March 5, 1785 There were other transfers upto 1795, after which Thomas Jr., was the grantee. He was living in the neighborhood of King's Mountain before 1785, since S of his Sons was living in this battle, 5 on the Side of the Colonies, and two on the Brittish Side.

He fought with John, Nathaniel and Thomas capturing two King's Men as noted, in the Battle of King's Mountain. His record of service also includes "The Battle of "Cowpen fie described his part in that battle in an old letter. When recalling the battle he always concluded with "And the British, how they did runt". He was born in Virginia, moved to South Carolina, and is in the First Consus of that State, page 73. Later he moved to Jackson County, Ga. . e was a private in Capt. Nathaniel Welchs 2nd, Va. Reg.

In 1913, Mrs. Elizabeth Glover of Texas who was at that time more than 80 years old wrote: "Grandsire "Ben" was "Pa's" grandfather, and I saw him at our home in Campbell County, Georgia. He was a small man with dark eyes and hair and his wife Elizabeth Dyke

had light hair".

Deeds on record at Laurens, South Carolina show that Benjamin and Elizabeth Camp, sold land in Laurens County in 1790. The last record was Oct. 29, 1796, so then they must have moved to Georgia. Since Elizabeth did not sign the deed, it is supposed that she

died between 1790 and 1796.

In the Cherokee Land Lottery James Smith showed that Benjamin Camp, Sr., 249 Dist. Walton County, Ga., drew lot # 11, 25rd, Dist. 2nd Section Cherokee Co. New Casecand Cherokee Co.
