Thomas married Susan Waggoner. He served in the latter part of the Revolutionary War, attested by the Camp Bulletin Vol. No. 1, No. 4, page 4. He died in Spartanburg, Dist. South Carolina, having gone there on a visit. His widow Susan Camp came to Ga., about 1798 with her son-in-law, Joseph Camp, who had married his cousin, Elizabeth Camp. In 1819 Susan appoints Joseph as legal Attorney so evidently Thomas died between 1798 and 1819.

Mrs. Beeson has the correspondence, now in the Mary Vinson Memorial Library at Milledgeville, Ga., of Miss Lizzie Glover, Corsicana, Texas, when she was in her 83rd year. She writes: "John Camp was Grandma Arnold's Father and Grand Ma Camp's grandfather. After Grandson Tom's death, Grannie Susie lived with Grand Ma in Jackson County, Georgia. (She was from Holland)". She writes that as a child she saw Benjamin Camp at her father's home. She said "Grandsire Tom had to hide from the Tories and Grannie Susie put his food in a hollow log for him at night". (Camp Bulletin) Vol. 1, No. 4, Pub. Aug. 1926 is Thomas Camp (G.3). Served in Revolution. Rank not given, Artillery Regiment South Carolina. He enlisted Feb. 14, 1776.

RESIDENCE, Laurens County, Records South Carolina Deed Book C. Page 108. Patrick And Ann Riley sell land Dec. 3, 1788 and June 29, 1789. This was land which had come to Patrick by inheritance and by grant. To sell it required the signature of his wife, as well as his own.

Ann was married to Patrick Riley in Ireland.

Patrick Riley furnished flour, powder etc. for the militia in the year 1782, for which he received pay from the State of South Carolina, Sept. 13, 1785 on the sum of: Principal p 3-2-2, Interest p 0-4-4, per account for the Commission. Page 191 No. 649, Vol. V (5) that Patrick Riley was a soldier in the Revolution and that the old Rileys "Hated a Tory" but there were many soldiers by this name and Mrs. Beeson did not know which service to claim.

The genealogy was taken from the Riley Bible, in possession of Mrs. William Riley, Anderson, South Carolina.

Abraham Riley's family was taken from his Bible in possession of Mrs. Emma Riley Wood, Conyers, Georgia. (Note Patrick Riley (1780-1823) had a brother named Abraham who also settled in South Carolina). James Riley's family was taken from his Bible in possession of Mrs. W. C. Bunnett, Douglasville, Ga., Route 6. Mrs. Beeson gives this complete genealogy to clear the record from confusion.

The children of Ann and Patrick Riley are listed under ANN RILEY, PATRIOT. Abraham Riley, being the 6th Son. He was born 1782.

Page 108, Patrick and Ann Riley of Ninety Six, Laurens Co., granted to John Riley by His Majesty's Letters Patent under the 1775, and in the same deed, 106A originally granted unto Patrick Riley by the States letters patent, under the hand of Wm. Moultrie, the then Governor. Jan. 5, 1786.
