Frederick County, Maryland Land Records, Liber G and H and Abstracts 1761-63 by Patricia Bbelard Anderson:

Liber H, Daniel Collings recorded supersedeas 17 Aug 1762 against Alexander Waddle.

Liber F Abstracts 1756-61, pp. 301. William Young recorded supersedeas 17 Aug 1757 against William Orris, James Veatch, Jr. and Daniel Collings for 22 pounds 5 shillings, 2 pence. 16 Aug 1757, before James Wood, Charles Jones.

York County, South Carolina Minute Book A, page 86 - John Fondren vs. Daniel Collins for Trespass. On motion of defendant's attorney the plaintiff was non-suited. When the plaintiff failed to prosecute the case in the October Court of 1786, the action was re-instated.

York County Minute Book A, page 17, April Term 1786. Ordered that Joseph Collins be appointed overseer of the road leading from the north line of Hugh Quinns in that part between north line and Buffaloe Creek...Joseph Collins to have power to pay out and cut said road the highest and best way from the North Carolina line to Mr. Quinns. Thomas Collins and Joseph Collins served on the 1790 and 1794 Grand Jurys. The 1790 Census, York County - Thomas and Daniel Collins. This is the last record of Daniel.

Comment: In 1740 Pennsylvania Germans followed the old Monocacy Trail and settled in Grayson, Creagerstown and Frederick, Lower Potomack Hundred.

CHILD 1 - John E. Collins

John E. Collins, Revolutionary War Soldier, listed 1820 Hall County Census, 1830-1850 Cobb County Census. He was born in Maryland but his family removed to Camden District, York County, South Carolina before the American Revolution.
