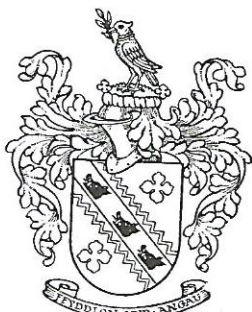

DAVIDSON, formerly OF INCHMARLO, now OF TILLYCHETLY AND DESS

COLIN KEPPEL DAVIDSON, C.I.E. (1935), O.B.E. (Mil. 1919), served in Great War 1914-19 as Capt. R.A., in France, Gallipoli and Mesopotamia (two despatches, Gallipoli 1915 and Mesopotamia 1918), Officer of Order of Nichan Iftikhar (Tunis) Clerk of the House of Lords since 1919 and Taxing Master of Private Bills, b. 1 Sept. 1895.
