EYRE formerly OF BRICKWORTH AND LANDFORD

THE LATE HENRY JOHN ANDREWS EYRE, late of Shaw House, Berks, J.P., late Maj. Imperial Yeomanry, formerly Capt. Berkshire Yeomanry, served in S. Africa 1900-1, b. 15 Sept. 1854; educ. Eton and Univ. Coll. Oxford; d. 14 Feb. 1917.
 Maj. Eyre sold Shaw House to the Hon. Mrs. Walter Farquhar in 1905.



Lineage.—GILES EYRE, of Brickworth, near Salisbury, Sheriff of Wilts, 1640, and son of Thomas Eyre, of Salisbury, who d. 1628 (see *Wills of St. John's Wood* for earlier lineage), suffered much for his opposition to the government measures temp. JAMES I and CHARLES I, and sat with three of his sons in the Council of OLIVER CROMWELL, Capt. 27 Feb. 1572; m. 1603, Jane, dau. and heiress of Ambrose Snelgrove, of Redlynch, Wilts. He was bur. at Whitechapel 16 Jan. 1655, having had issue,

He m. Dorothy, dau. of John Ryves, of Ransdon, Dorset. He d. 2 June, 1695. His eldest son,

GILES EYRE, of Brickworth, M.P. for Downton, 5th, 6th and 7th Parliaments of Queen ANNE, m. Mabel, dau. of Alexander Thayne, of Cowesfield, Wilts, and was bur. 28 Nov. 1734. His eldest son,

GILES EYRE, of Brickworth, M.P. for Downton 1715, 1722 and 1727; b. 1692; d.s.p. 7 June, 1750. His brother,
 JOHN EYRE, of Landford, Wilts, b. 1693, m. Jane, dau. of Maurice Bockland, of Standlynch, Wilts, and had issue. The eldest son,
 HENRY EYRE, of Brickworth, s. his uncle Giles, m. his cousin, Harriett, dau. of John Eyre, of Putney, and d.s.p. (see EYRE of Warrens). His brother,

 Frances Elizabeth, of Landford and Brickworth, m. 21 Feb. 1821, Thomas Bolton (afterwards Nelson), 2nd Earl Nelson, nephew of the great Admiral Viscount Nelson. He d. 1 Nov. 1835. She d. 28 March, 1878, leaving issue (see BURKE's *Peerage*).
