

Thomas Girty, 'of Pitt township, who was in company with the before-mentioned George Brickell, deposeth and said, that the beforementioned Williams told him that the Indians were going to war; that Williams had this information from one Abraham Kuhn, a white man, who is married to an Indian woman, by which means he is made a Wyandott Chief; that this deponent went into the Council House on the 3d inst. and saw the Indians sitting in council, and upon being informed who this deponent was, they were silent; that this deponent was asked frequently if Hutchins was gone to run the line, which he denied, and was told at the same time, that the Indians meant to cut him off and all his men; that the Cherokees and Shawanees chased Cayasuta, when he went to Mingoe town with a speech to the Indians, desiring them not to go to war against the Americans, and ~~would have killed~~ them had he not made his escape, and further this deponent saith not.
