Simon Heller was born at Petersheim, Germany in the Palatinate. Was a prominent and influential citizen, his name appearing in the Pennsylvania Archives, second series. He was an active member first, of the Chestnut Hill Reformed Church, Lehigh County; then of the lower Saucon Reformed Congregation and first trustee of the Church.

John Heller was born in Northampton County, Pa. and served as a member of the Third Pennsylvania Regiment during the Revolutionary War under Captain Lenox and Colonel McGaw. In 1780 was a private in Captain Richard Shaw's Company, 5th Battalion, Northampton Co., Pa. Militia. (1780 Record taken from D.A.R. Records

Belinda Van Aucken or Blandenah Vanaucuh (as it appears in the original record) of New Jersey was a descendant of an old and aristocratic German family. (Taken from Fulton County History 1845).

Mary Black was born in ⁴ Pennsylvania (probably Union Co.) the daughter of Robert Black and Hannah Jones who were married in Union County, Pa. in November, 1808; her brother Nicholas Jones was present. During this last service, he became sick in camp, remained sick after his return home, where, in consequence of that illness, he died sometime in January, 1815. (Pension Records, O.W.Wid.
