

BIOGRAPHIES

Benjamin O. Holland (1867 -) was born in Monongalia County and educated in the public schools. In 1882, he was engaged as an employee in the mercnatile business. He began business for himself in Logan in 1890 and continued until 1903. He was Secretary and Director in the Guyan Coal Co. And a director in the Hudson School Furniture Company of Logan. He was appointed postmaster of Logan by President McKinley, and in 1902, was elected to the State Senate.

Claude Llewellyn Holland (1879-), born in Monogalia Co., West Virginia, was a physician in the City of Fairmont. He specialized in the diagnosis and treatment of the diseases of children. Dr. Holland was raised on the home farm and was educated in local schools. Afterwards, he attended the State Normal School in Fairmont and the University of West Virginia, but did not graduate from either. He received his M. D. Degree in 1901 from Maryland Medical College in Baltimore, and did special postgraduate work in children's diseases at Harvard University, Massachusettts. He was the third physician in West Virginia to specialize in this field. Dr. Holland married Elsie Amos, of Fairmont, a daughter of Justice Elias S. Amos, in 1903. They had two sons.

HISTORY OF GWINNETT COUNTY, GEORGIA

Page 611-612:

"Sam Holland married Malissee Bennett and moved from North Carolina to Hall County, Georgia. He was a wheelwright by trade and his services were in constant demand in erecting wheat and corn mills in his community.

One of his children was Archibald H.

Holland, who spent most of his life in Gwinnett County. He was a farmer, a preacher of the Baptist faith and educate dhis children far above the average of his day. He was born Aug. 2, 1844 and died Feb. 21, 1934. He resided in Lawrenceville, perhaps forty years. At the age of 16 young Holland attended a rally for enlisting recruits for the Confederate army He became so enthused on this occasion that he immediately joined Company I, 24th Ga. Regiment, Woffard's Brigade, Longstreet's Corps, Lee's army. His mother, hearing of her son's joining the army, mounted a horse and started after him, but was not able to catch up with the young soldier. He, together with the other volunteers, spent the first night in Lawrenceville campground, then moved on to Virginia. He was in many battles, and during the second day's fighting at Gettttysburg was wounded, captured and sent to David's Island, N. Y. Later, he was echanged and granted a leave of absence for the remainder of the year.

He was married three times. His first wife was Polly Pugh of Hall County. Their only child was Louvenia Arvaline, who married A. T. Patterson (Children: Mattie, Mae, James, Tandy, Lois and A. T.). his second wife was Jeannette Mauldin. Children: Ezekiel H., who married Neppie Warren. (Children: Warren, Frank, Dorothy, Francis, Truman, Jennette); Truman M. who married Ida Wall. (Children: Dinsmore, Truman, Glenn and Lanelle); Cora Lee who married (1) J. A. Coffee. (Children: Morris, William) and (2) Edward Wheeler; Anna Belle, who married Manassa Sammon (Children: Margaret); Willis A., who married Cora Webb (children: Willis, Robert, John, Martha Sue and Jack); Alice who married Bob Sammon (Children: Dick, Tom, Harry

and Alice May). His third wife was Mollie Howington."

Union Soldiers, Civil War

Holland, Daniel Ringgold. Co. B, 1st Regt. Potomac Home Brigade "Cole's" Cavalry (US) Millstone. Enlisted at Clear Spring, 24 Aug 1861. Captured the following year near Hancock and sent to Libby Prison at Richmond, for two weeks and then exchanged. In the thick of action at Brandy Station, in 1863, he was captured again, this time by Mosby's guerillas, and held for two and one-half months. Holland fought at first and second Winchester and his reputation was such that the Rebels offered him \$2,000 to change sides. After the war he worked for the C & O Canal and later opened a store at Lappan's Crossroads. His brother, Joseph, served in the U.S. Army, was captured and jailed at Libby Prison, where he died.

"Mary was born 7 September 1830, the youngest of nine children born to Benjamin Council and his wife, Charlotte Holland, between 1808 and 1830....I was lucky enough to find a relative with a Bible record of the children, so my information about their names and ages is accurate by family records. Benjamin died unexpectantly in 184041; Charlotte must have died before he did, because she is not mentioned in any of the estate papers. Four of the children were apparently grown when he died. Two girls,

Charlotte and Elmina, both must have also died before Benjamin, because his estate papers mention only three minor children: Albert, Benjamin and our Mary, who was called Polly...When Benjamin died, the oldest boy, Wiley, was named by the court to be guardian to the three minor children. and then the fur starts to fly in court papers. Albert sued for his share and Wiley was several times called to court to "report an account of his acts as Mary's guardian." Son, Benjamin's name doesn't turn up in these court records, but from later censuses I figured out that he got married and lived happily ever after. Well, for some reason, in 1849 the court named John M. Holland as Mary's guardian, and that is where she is at eighteen in the 1850 census...the household of John M. Holland. I'm pretty sure that John M. Was Mary's uncle---her motherrr's brother....Obviously we'll never know what really happened to little Mary "Polly" Councill, who was an orphan at ten, but she was clearly a survivor. She married Obediah Gardner in 1854, had two children by Obediah, and then when he died in 1861, she married again almost at once, a George Washington Holland; in fact, she signed Obediah's death certificate as "Mary Holland".

The Hollands came over from England or Scotland about 1725. They settled in Virginia (See Burke's Landed Gentry). In Griffin's History of Rutherford County, N. C. I find what I think is one of our ancestors---James Holland. He appeared to be a man of means. He deeded a tract of land to Rutherford Co. for the building of the first courthouse built in that county.

In the 1790 Census for South Carolina, we find in Greenville District, just south of

Rutherford Co., N. C., Sam Holland. He was, at that time, the father of three boys, one of whom was over 16 years of age. Sam Holland moved to Fayette Co., Ga. between 1790 and 1823. James Holland was born in 1800, in all probability in S. C. In 1823 or the early spring of 1824, James Holland moved with his family, consisting of his wife and wife's mother, from Fayette Co., Ga. to Black Dirt, Carroll Co., Ga. Uncle Lindsey Holland was born in 1824 in Carroll Co., Ga.

My great grandfather, Sam Holland, had a son, Sam. This Sam settled in Paulding Co. Two sons that I am sure of--Thomas and George lived near the line of Paulding and Haralson. George operated a blacksmith shop. He got into a fight with a man aand this man threw a rock that killed George.
