S. Y. Jameson Funeral Held

Funeral services for Samuel Y. Jameson, a veteran of World War I, who died Tuesday at the Veterans' Hospital in Augusta, were held Wednesday at the graveside in West View Cemetery. Dr. James W. Middleton officiated.

Mr. Jameson was wounded in the Argonne Forest. He received the Distinguished Service Medal and the Order of the Purple Heart.

He was the son of the late Dr. S. Y. Jameson, Baptist minister who was at one time president of Mercer University. He attended Atlanta public schools and re-

ceived his A. B. and LL.B. degrees from Mercer.

Mr. Jameson was a member of the Kappa Alpha fraternity at Mercer and First Baptist Church here, practiced law until nine years ago when his health began to fail.

Survivors include his mother, Mrs. S. Y. Jameson; four sisters, Miss Vera Jameson and Mrs. B. Kilbride, of Atlanta, Mrs. Tom Rasco, of Hopkinsville, Mrs. Ralph Ellis, of Due West, S. C., and a brother, William Jameson, of Atlanta.
