Justis, Moses

He served forty days in the militia during 1782. A.A.4151; V21.

Juttier, Pierre

He enlisted in the First Regiment during May 1777. N.A.853.

Kainard, John

He served in the militia under Col. Waters after the fall of Charleston. A.A.4284; X2571.

Kainard, Martin, Sr.

He served in the militia under Col. Waters before the fall of Charleston. A.A.4286; X2573.

Kainard, Martin, Jr.

He served in the militia under Col. Waters after the fall of Charleston. A.A.4285; X2572.

Kaine, Dennis

He enlisted in the Fourth Regiment on 14 February 1776. N.A.853.

Kaiser, John Jacob

He served three years as inspector or adjutant of the Charleston Brigade. A.A.4154½.

Kalkoffen, Jacob

He enlisted in the Second Regiment on 1 July 1779 as a sergeant under Capt. Daniel Mazyck. Saffell, p. 294; Y566; N.A.246; N.A.853.

Kalkoffen, John

He served in the Second Regiment. Y566.

Kaloff, Frederick

See Frederick Keloff.

Kalteissen, Michael

He served as a lieutenant in the German Fusiliers of Charleston during 1775 before resigning to become wagonmaster general of the Provincial Army of South Carolina. At some time, he was captain of the marines aboard the frigate South Carolina. Council of Safety, 2 December 1775; Yearbook, 1885; A.A.404; A.A.4154A; Y822; Z377.

Kaltz, Martin

He served in the militia under Col. Waters after the fall of Charleston. A.A.4155; X2570.

Kanady, Thomas

He served ten months and eight days in the militia under Capt. John Baxter and General Marion from 1 November 1780 to 8 September 1781. A.A.4232; Y1239.

Kanley, John

He served one hundred fifteen days in the militia. A.A.4159; R199.

Kanseiar, John

He enlisted during 1775 under Capt. Polk and Colonel Thomson in the Rangers. He served throughout the war as a volunteer and draftee and was in the battles at Rocky Mount, Hanging Rock, Fish Dam Ford, Blackstock's Plantation, Sumter's Defeat, Kings Mountain and was in many skirmishes. A.A.4159A.

Kantzman, Andrew

He served in the German Fusiliers of Charleston during 1775. Yearbook, 1885.

Karnon, Thomas

Kar, James

He enlisted in the Fifth Regiment as a corporal on 11 April 1776 and was discharged on 30 May 1777. N.A.853.

Karr, Abraham

He served in the light dragoons under Capt. Jacob Barnett, Lt. Col. Henry Hampton and Gen. Sumter during 1781. Salley, Doc., p. 54; M292.

Karwon, Thomas

He was an ensign under Capt. Benjamin Marion and Col. Singleton during 1775. In addition, he supplied beef for Continental use during 1781 and also provided provisions and forage for the militia during 1781. During 1782, he served in the militia as an adjutant under Gen. Marion. (Addison, Thomas); L95; Council
