## **SAME REFERENCES AS FOR JOHN LINDLEY (PATRIOT)**

The record is that in 1800 Jonathan Lindley signed a sales slip of a tract of land which was witnessed by John Nelso, Jr., and John Robinson. The record is that in 1800 Jonathan Lindley in Orange County, North Carolina had in his family "1 male under 10, 1 male between 10 and 16, 1 male between 16 and 26, and 1 male between 26 and 45, 4 females under 10, one female between 10 and 16, and one between 26 and 45. (9 in 1800).

In 1820 he was living in Walton County, Georgia, coming from Pendleton District, South Carolina. Then he had a family of "3 males under 10, 1 male between 10 and 16, and one between 25 and 45, and 3 males beyond 45".

## **PROOF OF RESIDENCES:**

Jonathan Lindley in 1800 signed a sales slip of a tract of land which was witnessed by John Nelson, Jr., and John Robinson. John Wilson, one of a quorum for Pendleton District, certified that, "Nancy Lindley renounced all claims to the land and signed her dower. '(Signed)' Nancy Lindley". Recorded March 4, 1811. Jonathan and Nancy Blair Lindley were married in Orange County, North Carolina; they then came to Old Pendleton District, South Carolina, and finally to Walton County, Ga. They moved to Cobb County, Ga., with their son, James Lindley, whose wife was Mary Blair, James's first cousin. Nancy Blair, Jonathan's wife died and was buried in Walton Co., Ga. Jonathan Lindley was buried at Baptist cemetery, Powder Springs, Georgia.
