## REVOLUTIONARY RECORDS.

"Thomas Lindley was a soldier in the Revolution being listed in-"The Georgia Roster" page 396, Lucian L. Knight, page 396, In the "Paid In" money list is the name of Thomas Lindley published as Appendix E, Ga. Soldiers of the Line under the direction of Mrs. Wm. Lawson Peel from original papers in the Office of the Secretary of State.

Thomas Lindley's name is in the First Census, South Carolina. His will is at Laurens Court House in South Carolina. In his will he names his wife and each of his twelve children. In the same Court House are the records of all of his sons and some of his daughters. Other papers (legal) also mentioned him.

Mrs. Lizzie Glover, a kinswoman of Corsicana, Texas wrote in her memoirs (1913) "Jonathan Lindley was a Quaker but the Blairs fought in the Revolution". It was the Abercrombies who dressed their son as a girl, during the Revolution". Some of the Old Lindleys fought."

At Anderson South Carolina in the old Orange County Records are the records of Jehanathan Lindley and Nancey Blair before they came to Monroe County, Georgia. (About 1820).
