

The brickwall I would like you to work on is my gg-grandfather, Jesse M. Lamb, Sr. His daughter, Lillian Leigh Lamb, lived into her 90s, dying when I was 13 years old. She told me and others pass down that he was born in Ireland. Lilly said that he spoke with a distinctive accent that marked him as Irish. In a couple of records, he notes that he was born in Ireland but in others that he was born in Raleigh, NC. He was a gunsmith, and based on the distinctive trademark he used on the butts of his rifles, I believe he might have been related to the Jamestown gunsmiths who were originally Quakers in North Carolina and Virginia. He was “colorful” spending time in prison for marrying his step-daughter, Lillian’s mother. But an unknown someone or possibly someones worked on the family’s behalf and got him out of prison and had his marriage legitimized by the Georgia legislature. Of course that didn’t legitimize the marriage in everyone’s eyes and there was gossip about the family into my mother’s generation. Most moved away from Covington to get away from it.

I am sending you everything I have in the event there is some clue buried in the details that I have missed. I have not had the opportunity to visit North Carolina. All my research has been onsite in the Atlanta area and online. Let me know if you would like copies of the pension applications, photos of Jesse and his gun, and other docs. To recap, here are my questions.

Who were Jesse M. Lamb, Sr.’s parents?

Was Jesse a part of the Jamestown gunsmiths?

If Jesse was born in North Carolina and not Ireland, who was?

The Newton County Grand Jury voided Jesse and Sarah's marriage based on the "Levitical Laws." If you go to the Newton County Probate Court and look at the Marriage Books for 1869-70, you'll see the marriage record struck through. Jesse was sentenced to prison for incest. He served for about 14 months and was pardoned. Once he came home, he and Elizabeth set up housekeeping and lived together as husband and wife the rest of their lives.

"Which causes The Covington Enterprise to try a hand in this wise:

'We wish that our old friend, Esquire Marion Berry, was alive so that he could give Uncle Buck a few lessons in rifle shooting. The 'squire, at the age of seventy years, got our gunsmith, MR. JESSE LAMB, to make him a rifle that carried 130 bullets to the pound of lead. He once bored a hole in a gate post with a small gimlet and stepped off 100 yards to show the boys how well he could shoot off-hand. The first shot he fired went through the gimlet hole without scraping either side, and for 129 straight shots he put every bullet through the same hole, rubbing it so slick w/lead that it looked as if someone had been swabbing it out with a greasy rag. The 'squire had great confidence in his rifle and could clip the wings off a bumble bee in the air at 100 yards without touching its body. The 'squire got so that he could shoot at a board at the distance of 200 yards and after the first bullet went through the board he would bet ten to one that he could shoot 1,000 more bullets through the same hole."

---

Per Jesse's application for Confederate Pension, he was born in "Gilbert County, North Carolina 1820." Since there is no Gilbert County, I will assume he meant GUILFORD. I have no way of knowing if he prepared the document himself, or had another do it for him with only his signature being by his hand. Other details state that he has living in Georgia since 1849, and that his wife is an invalid.

Briggs, Author and historian

Jamestown in southwest Guilford County was a significant rifle-making center from the era of the American Revolution through the American Civil War. In this one area, civilian and military rifles and other small arms were manufactured and repaired. Mr. Briggs is a recognized authority on gun making in Guilford County in the 18th and 19th centuries. His printed work, *The Longrifle Makers of Guilford County: The Jamestown Rifles*, is a history of these skilled artisans and a guide to their products. Mr. Briggs' lecture will be highlighted with surviving examples of these rare and collectable firearms.

Today we are going to look at the third North Carolina Longrifle School in our list of nine. The Guilford County - Jamestown School was later starting than the most of the other Schools on our list, but made up for this by becoming the largest in the State of North Carolina and the South. I have been able to document and name in my book, 87 men that worked in this School as gunsmiths, gun-stockers, and apprentices between 1795 and 1902. The Longrifles they made were known locally as "Jamestown Rifles" after the small Quaker Community that most of the gun shops were centered around.

...

Thaddeus Gardner built a large business over the years with the help of his sons William (born 1807), Grafton (born 1817 and later Superintendent of the Confederate Gun Factory in Jamestown, Mendenhall, Jones & Gardner), and Bartlett (born 1819) and apprentices such as William Lamb (born 1806) that was also his nephew. Thaddeus had a sister Mary Lamb that was disowned by Deep River Monthly Meeting for marrying out of meeting in 1805, she gave birth to William a year later. He worked for his uncle in the 1820's and must have been his partner for a period as three Longrifles exist signed T.G. & W.L. William Lamb would go on to become the best known and widely respected of all Guilford County gunsmiths.

...

Though he worked for over 50 years as a gun maker, only a few of his Longrifles survive today. I have only seen five that are signed T.G. and three from his partnership with William Lamb signed T.G. & W.L. All of the Longrifles that I have seen that were signed T.G. have short one screw barrel tangs, unlike most Guilford Longrifles that have long, three screw tangs. I think Thaddeus did contribute most to what became the School's slender stock architecture and is responsible for the Jamestown Style double set triggers. I also believe he created the Guilford Style broken or interrupted fore-stock molding. I have never seen a signed half-stock or percussion Longrifle by him, but there must have been some made if the shop was still making 100 completed rifles a year in 1850. Perhaps one will surface in the future.

I'm posting the majority of my Lamb research starting with Robert Lamb and his wife Rachel Taylor and their children. They were Quakers in North Carolina. Several of Robert and Rachel's children left N. C. and moved through Tennessee into southwestern Kentucky (Livingston, Caldwell, Union, Webster, Crittenden and other counties), with a few moving on into Indiana and Illinois from Kentucky.

If anyone has any corrections/deletions to make, I'm willing to consider them. I'm handicapped and can only do research now via the Internet. As many of us know, some of the genealogy stuff on the internet is garbage. I try to weed that out, BUT I can't guarantee that everything I have is the proverbial "God's truth." So, with that caveat, here goes...!
