DECLARATION OF SOLDIER FOR PENSION.

To be executed before Judge or Clerk of Court.

On this 20th day of November, A. D. one thousand eight hundred
and seventy two, personally appeared before me, William E. Baxley, Judge Probate Court
of the Bates County Probate Court, a Court of Record within and for the
county and State aforesaid, M. M. Henry, aged eighty
two years, a resident of Walden Creek Township, County of Bates,
State of Missouri, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is married;
that his wife's name was Harap Moody, to whom he was married
at Wayne County Kentucky, on the first
day of May, 1815; that he served the full period of sixty days in the (1) military
service of the United States in the war of 1812; that he is the identical M. M. Henry
who (2) enlisted in Captain Millers
company, 7th regiment, 1st brigade, 1st division, at Manassas
Kentucky, on the fall day of 1812 or 1813.
1814 and was honorably discharged at Chesapeake place on the
November following enlistment, 1814; that (3) he was in no
general engagement, but was a general skirmisher with
British and Indians on Thames River & at Moravian town; that
his discharge was sent to Washington with application for Land Warrants
that he received two Land Warrants, one for 66 acres N. 24870,
the other he has misplaced & cannot give the number

that he, at no time during the late rebellion against the authority of the United States, adhered to the cause of the enemies of the Government, giving them aid or comfort, or exercised the functions of any office whatever under any authority, or pretended authority, in hostility to the United States; and that he will support the Constitution of the United States; that he is not in receipt of a pension under any previous act; that he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States, under the provision of the act approved February 14, 1871, and he hereby constitutes and appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation,

Edmund S. Wong of Jefferson City, Mo. his true
and lawful attorney to prosecute his claim and obtain the pension certificate that may be issued; that his post
office is at Marion, County of Bates, State of Missouri;
that his domicile or place of abode is Walden Creek Township, Bates Co Mo
Walden Creek

On this the Twenty Second day of June A.D.
one thousand eight hundred and fifty five, appearing before me a Justice of the Peace within
and for the county and State of said Missouri Mc
Henry aged 64 years a resident of Bates county in
the State of Missouri who being duly sworn according to
law declares that he is the identical person who
was a Private in the Company commanded by Captain
John Miller the regiment not indicated but commanded
by Michael Ball in the war with Great Britain
around 1812 he volunteered himself for the term
three months and continued in actual service in
said war for fourteen days that he has heretofore
never applied for County land under act of
September 20th 1850 and also Land Warrant No 24870
for 40 acres which he has since legally disposed of
and cannot now return - he makes this declaration
for the purpose of obtaining the additional County land
to which he may be entitled under the act of March
3rd 1855 he also declares that he has never applied for
nor received under this or any act of Congress any
County land warrant except the one above mentioned
he appoints J. H. Thompson his attorney to prosecute
and defend his claim

this 26th day of June A.D. 1855
