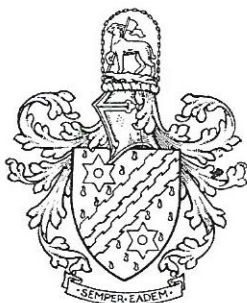


OVEY OF HERNES

Arms.—Vert, guttée d'or, two bendlets sinister, and raguly, between as many mullets of six points or, pierced of the first. **Crest.**—Upon a rock ppr., a lamb passant arg., guttée-de-sang, supporting with the dexter fore-foot, a flagstaff in bend sinister or, therefrom flowing a pennon of the second, the whole within a chain in arch of the third. **Motto.**—Semper eadem.

MARY MATILDA, LADY OWEN-MACKENZIE, of Bettws Hall, Montgomery, J.P. Suffolk; m. 1st Francis Fenwick; and 2ndly, Archibald George Bovill, Barrister-at-Law; and 3rdly, 17 July, 1905 (as his second wife), Sir George Sutherland-Mackenzie K.C.M.G., C.B., who d. 1 Nov. 1910. She assumed by Royal Licence 1909, her maiden name of OWEN on s. to the Bettws estates. By her first marriage she has issue,
