Dear Friend,

According to promise,
I avail myself of the present
opportunity of dropping you a few
lines before I will enclose you
that I got back to camp safe,
and am in fine health.
The health of the company (I
am glad that it can state) is
improving and I hope will con-
tinue so. I alone is
getting well for I have been
had a very hard time of it.
He was taken as you know
with the benen fever, and

it when he was removed to
us with the arctic fever. He is
about to get well of all, which is
a good thing, I think it to be very
wonderful to get well again.

The dissatisfaction among the
troop of the 57th Regt. like told
at Collet and some other places

when I was at home. They are
~~being brought in and are~~
too late to be court-martialed, and
I hope that justice will be
rightly dealt out to them
for it is a disgrace on our army.
I am truly sorry that such is the

ed the other day here between Sharp
and Judge. I don't know

to the conclusion to join them
together with a ship when
Judge came to inquire for Eli

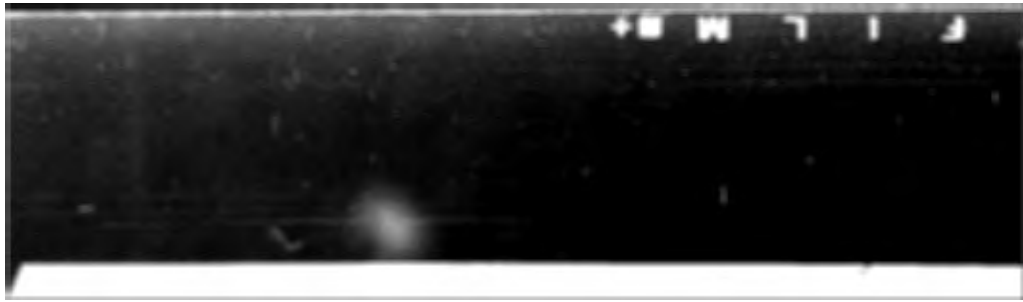
