I am sorry to be so tardy in sending you what information I have of my family but I have been trying to get as much information as possible before sending it in.

I am enclosing what I have but am not sure that John Heller born 1786 is the son of John Heller born 1736 but believe he is as they both lived in Wayne Co. and Richland Co., Ohio during the same period - 1813 to 1835 when John Heller(1786) came to Fulton Co., Ill. stopping at Dayton on the way. John Heller(1786) was the son of a John Heller who was in the Revolutionary War.
