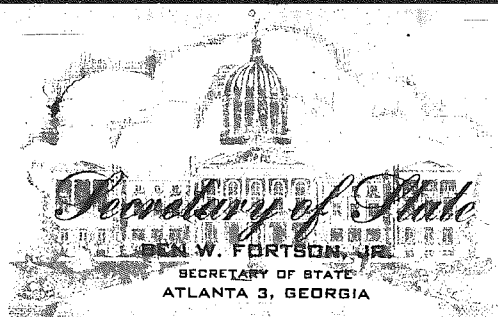

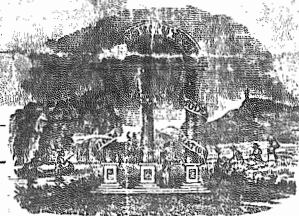

DEATH OF MRS. STEVENSON'S MOTHER.

Mrs. William M. Brown died at her home in this city, last Saturday night, after an illness of nearly three weeks.

Mrs. Brown had been ill with fever, and was suffering, when a few days before her death, she was attacked with another attack, and on Saturday morning Dr. Williams, of Boston, and Dr. Brown performed an operation, which after consultation was decided necessary. The operation was successful, but left her quite weak, and she failed to regain her strength.

The remains of Mrs. Brown were removed to her place yesterday morning for burial.

Mrs. Brown was the widow of Mr. J. Brown Brown, who died in 1855. After the death of her husband, she continued to reside on their plantation in Vermont county, until about 1865, when she moved to this city. A short time after her removal here for one year lived with parents etc. She then for a while with a children's institute. She was a member of Mr. J. E. Freeman, son of Dr. Smith's great-grandfather, and was then about 70 years of age. In early life she resided with the Methodist church, and for the last few years of her life she was one of a very numerous congregation, and through called upon to pass through great sorrows her faith in that great belief, but grew stronger and stronger.
