

PHILLIPPS formerly OF LOWER EATON
and KILGAINVIN

LIEUT.-COL. RICHARD BIDDULPH PHILLIPPS, R.A.M.C. (ret.), Medical Officer of Health, Auckland, New Zealand, M.R.C.S. and L.R.C.P. (1909), served in the Great War 1914-19, b. 13 Aug. 1884; *educ.* St. Paul's Sch. and Univ. Coll. London; *m.* 2 June, 1916, Katherine Jane Stewart.



Lineage.—OWEN PHILLIPPS, younger brother of John Phillipps, of Kilgainvin in the Parish of Disserth, co. Radnor, held lands in Disserth in 1595 but lived in Hereford. He *m.* Joan (will of 19 April, 1639, *pr.* 16 July, 1641), and had issue,

WILLIAM PHILLIPPS, of Madley, co. Hereford, and later of Huntingdon-in-Holmer, co. Hereford, Mayor of Hereford, 1646. Compounded for Madley as a Royalist at £68 in 1650. He *m.* Anne (will of 6 Sept. 1694, *pr.* 6 April, 1703) dau. of Henry Melling, Mayor of Hereford, 1646, and *d.* 26 May, 1666, (M.I. Hereford Cathedral cloister), leaving an eldest son,

JAMES PHILLIPPS, 2nd of Huntingdon-in-Holmer, s. to Kilgainvin, *bapt.* 26 April, 1636; *m.* 26 Nov. 1674, Mary (*d.* 17 June, 1699) dau. of Anthony Smyth, of Huntless, Much Marcle, co. Hereford, and *d.* a. Sept. 1705, having had with Mary, *m.* Henry Caldecott of Holmer House (see HEREFORD of *Sutton*) an eldest son,

JAMES PHILLIPPS, 3rd of Huntingdon-in-Holmer, *b.* 27 Nov. 1677; *m.* Mary, dau. of Thomas Alderne of Norton Canon and *d.* 1744, leaving a son,

THOMAS PHILLIPPS, 4th of Huntingdon-in-Holmer and of Lower Eaton, J.P. and sometime Chairman of Quarter Sessions, co. Hereford Barrister-at-Law. He was *b.* 16 April, 1707; *m.* 1st July, 1737, Lucy, dau. and co-heir of Edward Strong, of the Hide, Abbot's Langley, Herts, and had issue,

1. Mary, heir to her mother, *b.* 1740; *m.* 1768, Powell Snell of Guiting Grange, co. Gloucs, *d.s.p.* 1 Aug. 1812.

He *m.* 2ndly, 5 July, 1743, Sarah (*d.* 16 Sept. 1789), only dau. and heir of Robert Ravenhill of Eaton Bishop, and had with other issue who *d. unm.*

1. JOHN, his heir.

2. Robert, of Longworth in Lugwardine, co. Hereford, M.P. for Hereford, 1789, Mayor 1797, Recorder 1800. He was *b.* 22 June, 1742; *m.* 18 Sept. 1794, Mary Anne, dau. of Michael Biddulph of Ledbury and Crofton Hall (descended from King Edward III) and *d.* 1 Feb. 1822, having had, with other issue,

1. Robert Biddulph, 2nd of Longworth and of Hagley Park, co. Hereford, D.L., J.P. and High Sheriff, 1838, Barrister-at-Law, *b.* 30 July, 1798; *m.* 5 Aug. 1834, Elizabeth, dau. of John Barneby of Brockhampton, co. Hereford (see that family) and *d.* 17 May, 1864, having had issue; Elizabeth, a nun at Caen and Mary Amie, *d. unm.* 1 June, 1858.

1. Marian, *m.* 22 April, 1819, Charles David Gordon, Younger of Abergeldie, the friend of Byron, and had issue, (see GORDON of Abergeldie).

2. Isabella Frances, *m.* 31 Aug. 1824, the Rev. Bernard John Ward (*d.* 24 Jan. 1832), Vicar of Peterchurch, grandson of Bernard, 1st Viscount Bangor, and *d.* 1884, having had issue (see BURKE'S *Peerage*).

3. James, of Bryngwyn, ancestor of PHILLIPPS of Berwick House (see that family).

2. Sarah, *m.* 3 Feb. 1767, James Walwyn, of Longworth, M.P. for Hereford, and High Sheriff 1784, and had issue.

3. Eleanor, *m.* 25 Aug. 1785, John Evans, of the Byletts, and *d.* 1788.

4. Frances, *m.* 28 Sept. 1774, the Rev. Reginald Wynniatt of Stanton and Dymock, co. Gloucs. and *d.* 10 Dec. 1831.

5. Anne, *m.* 1st, 29 July, 1785, Francis William Thomas Brydges, of Tiberton, co. Hereford, High Sheriff, 1782, and 2ndly, 27 June, 1798, Joshua Scrope (*d.s.p.* Nov. 1820) of Long Sutton, Lincs, and *d.* 1 April 1829.

The REV. PHILLIPPS, 2nd of Lower Eaton, Rector of Stoke St. Milborough, Salop, *b.* 25 Aug. 1747; *m.* Aug. 1793, Anne, dau. of Charles Pye, of Wadley, Berks, and *d.* 20 Nov. 1812, having had issue,

1. JOHN, 3rd of Lower Eaton, J.P., co. Hereford, *b.* 26 Sept. 1795; *m.* 7 May, 1818, his first cousin, Harriet (*d.* 9 March, 1860), dau. of James Phillipps of Bryngwyn, and *d.* 20 Nov. 1852, having had, with other issue, Harriet, *m.* 9 Aug. 1842, the Rev. Rowland Hill of Hereford.

2. Charles, of Barham Hall, Suffolk, Capt. 3rd Light Dragoons, *b.* 11 Feb. 1797; *m.* 19 Aug. 1734, Maria, dau. of Joseph Burch Smyth of Stoke Hall, Suffolk, and had issue.

3. THOMAS, of whom presently.

4. Henry, of Manor House, Sproughton, Suffolk, D.L. and J.P., Lieut.-Col. 3rd Light Dragoons, *b.* Jan. 1806; *m.* March, 1841 Lucy, dau. of Joseph Burch Smyth, of Stoke Hall, and had issue.

5. Robert, Capt. R.N., *b.* 6 Aug. 1807.

1. Anne Isabella, *m.* 11 Dec. 1827, the Rev. James Grasett and *d.* 1869, having had issue.
