A melancholy accident happened last Thursday morning at Rae's Hall, near this place : a young gentlemen of the name of Clay, who lately arrived here in the ship Planter, from London, in going on board an Augusta trading boat lying in the river, the canoe in which he was overset, and he was unfortunately drowned. A Negro boy who was with him saved himself by swimming to the shore.

A young man, we are informed, was killed and scalped on Wednesday the 13th inst near Belcher's mills, on Great Ogechee, but whether by white or red savages is not known.
