Captain William Scott in 3rd. Ga. Battalion commanded by Lt. Cel. John McIntosh. The records of the Dept. of State in Atlanta, Ga., show that William Scott served in the battalion of Minutemen raised by the defense of that State by "Resolve of the Assembly", passed June 3rd, 1777 and that he was the service at the time the said Battalion was reduced by a subsequent resolve of March 1, 1778. These records show also, that he drew his bounty in Washington County, Georgia.

The records of the Adjutant General's Office in Washington show that William Scott served as Captain in the 3rd. Ga., Regiment commanded by Colonel John McIntosh in the Revoluntary War.

His name first appears in the undated list of officers and men showing pay drawn to Jan. 1, 1799. His name next appears on a pay roll of the Battalian covering the period from Nov. 1, 1799 to Feb. 1, 1782 showing time of service thirteen months. His name last appears on the pay roll covering the period from Jan. 1, to Dec. 31, 1782 of the extra officers of the Georgia Regiment, which shows time of service 12 months.
