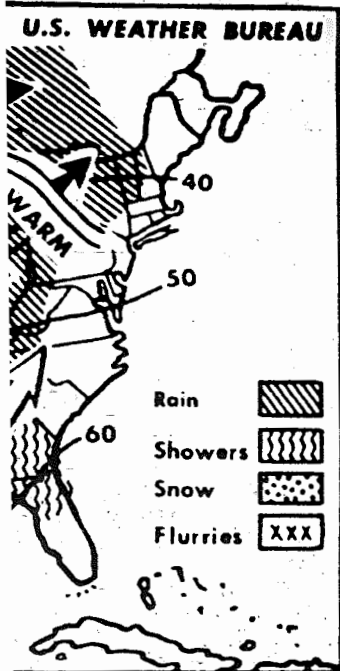

C. F. Sanders, In '61 Race, Dies at 49

Carl F. Sanders, an Atlanta lawyer who figured briefly in a complicated lieutenant governor's campaign in the spring of 1961, died Wednesday. He had been ill for two years, but continued to practice law until entering a hospital several days ago.

Mr. Sanders, 49, announced his candidacy for the office of lieutenant governor in March 1961, at a time when the present Gov. Carl E. Sanders also was campaigning for the post. After several newspaper exchanges with the then Sen. Sanders, Mr. Sanders withdrew from the race and announced his support of the present governor.

A member of West Manor Baptist Church and the Atlanta Chamber of Commerce, Mr. Sanders was formerly a member of the Atlanta police force. He lived at 3412 Elmtree Drive Southwest.

Funeral will be held at 2 p.m. Sunday at Cascade Hill. Burial will be in Westview Cemetery.

Surviving are his widow, the former Virginia Poucher Callo-way; daughter, Carolyn Sanders; sons, Jack Sanders and Danny Sanders, all of Atlanta; and sister, Mrs. Mae Allen, Austell.
