Skinner Records

Akersboro N.C. April 2nd 1863

Dr. Skinner Sir

as I have not heard from you
since I saw you, I take this method of dropping
you a few lines, as I am very anxious to hear from
you I have written you before but haven't heard
from you yet I suppose you did not rec^d. my note
I was at Akersboro last week but was about 2
hours too late to see you, I understand from a
gentleman to day that you are at Wilmington with
your company. I can't so very well understand it,
if it be so you must have orders from Genl. Whiting
as your time was not limited when I last saw you
if the report be correct you will please let me know
whether your company is organized or not or if
you are waiting for me, I haven't but very few men
yet as I was too late for the conscripts in this
and adjoining counties, there is another call in
Johnston County the 14th of this Inst at which I think
I can enlist several men besides picking up several
through the county. If you have a position in your
company for me you will please let me know
and allow me to remain at home to recruit
for a while, I think that I can in the course of
a month or so recruit several men, please let me
hear from you soon, Sir I am yours very respectfully

January in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight Hundred
and forty Robert M. Wooley of Montgomery County and State
of North Carolina being of perfect mind and memory do
constitute and make this my last will and testament as
follows:

Item 1st I lend unto my beloved wife Martha Wooley
during her natural life all of my land both lawgotten
and up lands where I now live and all of my Negroes
and their increase (viz) Jack, Selah, Anna, Lucy, Dora,
& Clara child all of my Horses Cattle of all kind, Hogs
& sheep and House Hold & Kitchen Furniture and Farming
tools and machines to her use and at her death to be
divided in the following manner

Item 2nd I give unto my daughters Margaret Garret the
Land they now live on which they have a deed for
one horse bridle & saddle, bed & furniture which they
have already in possession

Item 3rd I give unto my two sons John & Wooley and William
Wooley jointly the land on town Creek which land they
have in possession, Also a horse bridle & saddle
each which they have in possession -

Item 4 I give unto my son Asahel Wooley one horse
bridle & saddle when he comes twenty one year of age

Item 5th I give unto my son Saul Wooley one horse
bridle & saddle when he comes twenty one year of age

Item 6th I give unto my Daughter Mary Jane one horse
bridle & saddle one bed & furniture and two Hundred Dollars
in money when she comes twenty one year of age

Item 7th I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Wooley one
horse bridle & saddle one bed & furniture and two Hundred
Dollars in money when she comes twenty one year of age

Item 8th I give unto my son Robert Wooley one horse
bridle & saddle when he comes twenty one year of age

Item 9th I give unto my son Washington Wooley one
horse bridle & saddle when he comes twenty one year of age

Item 10th I give unto my Daughter Martha Wooley one horse
bridle & saddle one bed & furniture and two Hundred Dollars
in money when she comes twenty one year of age

This Indenture made this the Twentieth day of December
in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight Hundred
