Joseph Wilkins Gentleman produced a license to practice Law signed by 3 Judges of the General Court, in this court and the inferior courts of the Commonwealth and he took the oath of Fidelity to the Commonwealth and the oath of office according to law.

At court held December 28th, 1789 John L. Wilkins Esquire, produced a commission signed by 3 Judges of the General court to practice law in this and the inferior courts of the Commonwealth, and thereupon he took the oath of Fidelity to the Commonwealth and also the oath of office, thereupon he is allowed to practice in this court.

The above is what the orders of court show of Wilkins from 1732 to 1800. Brunswick Co was formed by Act of General Assembly in 1720 which says that the Parties of Prince George Co should have Jurisdiction until the Governor and council should establish a court for Brunswick Co, which was done May 1732 and the first court for this county was held May 11th 1732.

What the "Will Books" of Brunswick Co show of Wilkins from 1732 to 1850.

John L. Wilkins Jr. made will April 9th 1842 probated at March term of court 1845, (shows he died that year).

"Desires his debts to be paid out" of any property his Executors chose to sell. Gives all rest of his estate to Sister

Rebecca A. Broadnax during life or widowhood after death, or if she weddies again to Wm Edward Broadnax and Alex John Broadnax her sons. If Gallie Jones Broadnax her daughter lives to be married then my estate is to be divided into 3 parts

and 1/3, to be put in hands of a Trustee the proceed of some paid to her. Appoints brother Edmund Wilkins Executor and gives him

\$5,000. if he will act as such out of estate (all in his own hand-writing) which was proved by the oath of W.W. Wilkins and R.R. Jones, Edmund qualified as such Executor with John L. Wilkins, W.W. Wilkins and Edward T. Broadnax assurities, penalty of bond \$10,000.

Page 499 John Wilkins of Hanover Co parish of St. Mary gets from Phillip Morgan of Brunswick Co by deed August 2nd 1739 Consideration of 5 F 1000 acres land in said Co on the North side of Roanoke river.

("As consideration was so small it was" practically a gift, possibly his wife was Morgans daughter or was near kin to Wilkins, though then is nothing here to show this.)

Deed Book #2 By deed Nov. 4th 1741 Henry Wilkins of Prince George Co

Page 119 Va. gets from Wm Gorew and Anne his wife consideration of 5 F 550 acres land in Brunswick Co, it being the same land granted by letters patent to said Governor by letters patent dated June 1st 1741.

Page 329

In deed book at 329 a receipt is recorded dated July 22nd 1766 of Douglas Wilkins to Col. John Macklin his guardian in full for his part Fathers establish. This Douglas was a son of John Linberry Wilkins as shown by order Book #7 page 116 September court 1758, when Col. John Macklin was appointed by the court as guardian for Douglas and Edmund Wilkins orphans of John Linberry Wilkins, he qualified as such by giving bond for \$10,000. each and he Douglas was ordered to be bound out at court March 1769.

"This was always done in those times" notwithstanding (what property an orphan had.)

convey and sell to Wm W. Wilkins of same Co (land in Brun-
swick Co 1032 acres which said land was given to Edward
Stith by his father. Col. Drury Stith and he gave it to
Catherine Stith his sister who married John L. Wilkins.

92. By deed June 23th 1792 Wm D. Wilkins conveys this same land
back to J. L. Wilkins.

Joseph Wilkins married Elizabeth Jones as shown by Bond
dated September 20th 1799 Geo. 26 Jones surety on same.
she gives her consent by note to clerk saying she was 21
years old, Penalty 50P.

Richard Augustin Wilkins of Louisiana married
Matilda F. Meade Bond dated September 25th 1836 R. Kidder
Meade her guardian gives consent, she was a daughter of
R. Kidder Meade, as order of court October 27th 1834 when he
qualified as her Guardian giving Bond for \$10,000.
