DAVID LORRAINE WILSON-FARQUHARSON, D.S.O. (1902), 9th of Allargue, co. Aberdeen, late Lieut.-Col. The Royal Highland Regt. (Black Watch), d. 27 July, 1862; educ. Haileybury, Brasenose Coll. Oxford, and R.M.C. Sandhurst; s. his mother and aunts, who were Portioners of Allargue; adopted the additional name of FARQUHARSON 1893; m. 4 June, 1908, Alice Mary (d. 27 Feb. 1930), only dau. of the late John Sanderson, of Bullers Wood, Hinchhurst, and has issue,
