Edward Hagin, Rev. War Soldier, b. ca 1755 S. C., signed a petition along with others in Wrightsboro, Ga., 8/30/1774, respecting the dispute between Boston and Great Britain, that is, destroying of tea, etc. On 9/30/1784, he was granted 287 1/2 acres in Washington Co., Georgia's Roster of the Revolution by Lucian Lamar Knight. Certified as Refugee Soldier by Col. Elijah Clarke, and in Ga. Troops. Wilkes Co. deed dtd 2/2/1786, Edward Hagin and wife, Elizabeth, to Charles Carroll, 200 acres, Little River, mou. Kettle Creek. Edward Hagin was Capt. of 9th Co., Washington Co. Militia 1787; Coroner in Washington Co. 1790-92; removing to Clarke Co. before 1802 when he purchased 124 acres on Barbers Creek from Roger Cagle.

Edward Hagin made his LWT Clarke Co. dtd 1805 naming "all my children" and wife, Hannah. From various estate returns, legatees named were Edward, Jr. and James. Issue follows:

He d. 1814 Clarke Co. when bond of Jesse Roberts and Thomas Moore dtd 5/2/1814, Est. James Hagin, P. 35, Clarke Co. Admrs Bonds 1811-39. It is believed James Hagin m. Rachel Annis, b. 12/8/1774 dau. of Thomas Annis and wife, Alice Gayle of Va.
- III. Edward Hagin, Jr., b. 1782 Wilkes Co., Ga., d. after 1850 Coosa Co., Ala. m. 1st 1/8/1807 Sally Youngblood, Richmond Co., Ga. and 2d Heardy Porch, 10/29/1812 Clarke Co. Sally Youngblood, dau. of Peter and Susannah Youngblood of Edgefield Co., S. C., and she d. before 1812 Clarke Co., Ga. Edward Hagin, Jr. listed 1830 DeKalb Co., Ga. Census, removing Coosa Co. Ala. after 1845. Issue follows:

James, Oliver, and others. She was dau, of Samuel White Oliver, Laywer, born in Virginia, ran for Governor in 1836, died at the age of 36."

Edward Hagin is prob. a son of Thomas Hagin who died 3/1796 Edgefield Co., S. C., and wife, Sarah, who owned land in St. Paul's Parish of Richmond Co., Ga. Oct. 1769, and who, in 1766 petitioned for 100 acres on the Savannah River, Gr. Kicka Branch. He assisted in the appraisal of the est. of Benjamin Burgess Chaney, decd, 1783 in Wilkes Co., Ga., pt of sd est. being appraised in S. C. Edward Hagin was one of appraisers of est. of Greenberry Chaney, decd, in Wilkes Co. Thomas Hagin named only two children in his Will:

William Hagin, youngest, m. Rachel, his LWT dtd 3/28/1836, pvd 10/22/1836 Edgefield Co., S. C. Rebecca Hagin, youngest dau. also named, dau. in Will of Thomas Hagin.

James Hagin, prob. another son of Thomas Hagin, Rev. War Soldier, b. ca 1760, was found in Wilkes Co., Ga. in 1785, and m. Rachel Annis Gayle, dau. of Thomas and Alice Gayle of Va. James LWT dtd 9/1798 Greene Co., Ga., naming wife, Ann and Edward Hagin, exrs.

William Hagin, youngest son of Thomas, who d. 1836 Edgefield Co., S. C., named his wife, Rachel and children: Thomas, William, Rebecca Bussey, Sarah Bussey, with William Robertson and Thomas Hagin, exrs.

From The Moravians in Georgia by Fries, P. 220-224: "May 18, 1740, John Hagen arrived in Savannah. He remained in Savannah until February of 1742 when he went to Bethlehem and laboured among the white settlers, and in the West Indies. Was appointed Warden of the Nazareth Congregation and died at Shamokin in 1747."

Colonial Records of Georgia by Candler, V. II, P. 306: "Also desires the Trustees to give Johann Hagen, a brother of the Moravians, who is now going to Georgia, a Certificate under their seal that he is going thither ... Palace Court, Friday, Nov. 16, 1739."
